

## Rams crown two at H-10 conference tournament

ATLANTIC - Glenwood's Vinny Mayberry and C.J. Carter brought home individual titles and the Rams placed third at the Hawkeye 10 Conference wrestling meet Saturday in Atlantic.

The host Trojans had three individual champions and won the team title with 238 points. Creston was third with 228 followed by Glenwood's 160.5 points.

"I think our kids wrestled well," said Glenwood coach Tucker Weber. "We were open at three weights, it's hard to get some points and compete against full teams

when you're down three but we did wrestle well. Some of our kids beat a couple kids they lost to earlier this year."

Mayberry was repeat conference champion after winning the 106-pound division as a freshman last season. He won 113 this year with a 17-2, technical fall win over Council Bluff St. Albert's Christian Williams. Mayberry notched a pair of pins over Atlantic's Tave Jordan and Red Oak's Brandon Erp to reach the finals.

"Williams is ranked at 120 and he dropped down to 113," Weber said of Mayberry's finals match. "They wrestled earlier in the year and Vinney beat him by eight or nine last time so it's always good to see him beat kids by more

points. He wrestled well."

Carter, the No. 2 ranked 195-pounder in the state, also pinned his first two opponents - Clarinda's Brayden Northwehr and Council Bluffs Lewis Central's Dillon Woods - to reach the finals. In the championship match, the Ram junior won a hard fought 5-2 decision over Denison's Jaxson Hildrebrand.

"C.J. is probably one of our most improved wrestlers from last year as far as opening up and putting more skills in his arsenal," Weber said. "He's wrestled the kids from Denison once this year already and probably 10 or 11 times in their high school careers. When you

### Girls wrestling added as a sanctioned sport for 2022-23

The Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union Board of Directors has voted unanimously to sanction girls wrestling as the organization's 11th sport.

The vote was made at the IGHSU's Jan. 12 board of directors meeting and was announced prior to the start of the Iowa Wrestling Coaches and Officials Girls State Wrestling Tournament in Coralville.

The first IGHSU-sanctioned season will take place during the 2022-23 school year.

"We think there's a great foundation in place for the success of this sport and we intend to fully support these Iowa Girls as they continue their pursuit of championships," said IGHSU Executive Director Jean Bergner.

"As the sanctioning process unfolded, the Board was able to quickly approve this new opportunity for our girls and schools across the state. The increase in participation, the growth in youth wrestling and the willingness of our schools to commit to the sport all factored into this decision."

The IGHSU intends to follow the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) wrestling rules and guidelines.

The next steps in this process include meeting with an appointed IGHSU wrestling advisory committee this winter to finalize details for this roll-out year that include format for the season, classification system, weight classes, and postseason/tournament details.

Glenwood wrestling coach Tucker Weber, who has a handful of girls on this year's boy's squad, has long been in favor of the move.

"It needed to happen with the sport growing so much in our state," he said. "Girls wrestling girls and guys wrestling guys gives each gender a fair opportunity to compete."

To date, 58 schools have committed to sponsoring girls wrestling programs in Iowa. The latest data from trackwrestling.com shows 1,018 girls participating in high school wrestling, represented by over 185 Iowa schools.

Wrestling becomes the 11th sport to be sanctioned by the IGHSU and the first since bowling was added in 2007. Iowa is the 34th state association to sanction girls' wrestling.

## She Shoots, She Scores

■ Glenwood's Camden adds to career three-point record with school scoring title

It seems only fitting the record-breaking bucket was a three-pointer.

Glenwood's Madison Camden, already the school's all-time leader with 183 three-pointers and counting, added to her personal records last Tuesday by becoming the school's all-time scoring leader in 5-on-5. Her three-pointer in the third quarter of the Rams' 79-40 win over Creston gave her 1,296 points, surpassing previous leader Morgan Lucy.

Camden finished her night with 31 points - she hit 7-of-10 threes in the game - and a place in the Ram record books.

"My parents and friends told me I was 25 points away last night and they wanted me to get it at a home game because they thought it would be special in front of the home fans," Camden said.

Coach Brian Rasmussen agreed. Just after Camden took a skip pass from Danika Arnold and knocked down the corner three, the coach called a timeout, and it was announced she had indeed broken the scoring record.

"He gave me a hug so that was pretty sweet of him," Camden said of Rasmussen.

Lucy, a star center for the Rams from 2009-2012 before going to play basketball at Southwest Baptist University, remains the school's all-time leading rebounder. She was in attendance Tuesday night, and she too hugged Camden after the game.

"I've always looked up to her as a player," Camden said. "I saw her play a couple times when I was younger. I took a picture with her after the game."

Rasmussen first saw Camden play basketball in third grade at a youth league game. Almost immediately the coach knew she was special.

### Camden's big night helps Rams to 79-40 victory

Madison Camden scored a game-high 31 points and became Glenwood's all-time leading scorer in a 79-40 win over Creston last Tuesday.

Camden hit 10-of-14 shots on the night, including 7-of-10 three-pointers, for her game-high night. Her 1,309 points for her career broke the record of 1,295 points scored by Morgan Lucy from 2009-2012.

With two straight road games coming up for Glenwood, coach Brian Rasmussen said he and Camden's teammates wanted the senior guard to break the record at home.

And she did just that. Camden took a skip pass from Danika Arnold in the third quarter knocked down a three-pointer to break Lucy's record.

"She was pretty dialed in," Rasmussen said. "We wanted her to get the school record here. We set her up in position to do that. She was really efficient too. She wasn't just getting a lot of looks, she was efficient and didn't need a lot of shots."

The Rams (13-2 overall, 9-0 in the Hawkeye 10 Conference) wasted little time getting up on the Panthers, opening the game on an 18-6 run.

"That was probably one of our better starts of the season, we haven't been consistent in the first quarter through the year," he said. "This is more the standard we're looking for. I was excited about how focused we were and how we started and built from there."

The Rams, who shot 54 percent from

## Johnson's record-setting night lifts Glenwood to win

Caden Johnson had a record-setting night at the free throw line and scored a career-high 30 points in Glenwood's 61-58 win over Creston in boys Hawkeye 10 Conference boys basketball last Tuesday.

Johnson hit 18-of-18 free throws and 6-of-14 shots from the field for his career night. His perfect night at the free throw was a school record.

But it was Creston that played perfect early, taking a 16-6 lead after a quarter. Glenwood (8-7 overall, 5-5 in the conference) would rally in the second frame to trim the Panthers' lead to 30-23 at the break.

In the third quarter the Rams turned up the head defensively and outscored the Panthers 17-10 in the frame to tie the game heading into the fourth quarter.

"I thought the second half our defense was much better," said Glenwood coach Curt Schulte. "We held

them to 10 points that third quarter. I was really pleased with that."

Creston shot 43.8 percent from the field (21-of-48) to the Rams' 37.3 percent (19-of-51) but Glenwood was 21-of-25 at the line the Panthers' 10-of-15 night and had just eight turnovers.

"We came up with big stops when we needed it and we really took good care of the basketball," he said. "That was a huge key for us also."

Johnson, who was the lone Ram in double figures, hit big shot after big shot in the win. The junior point guard also dished out six assists and grabbed four steals.

"He played a fantastic ballgame," Schulte said.

Cael Tuner led Creston with 18 points and Khalil Sherrod added 13.

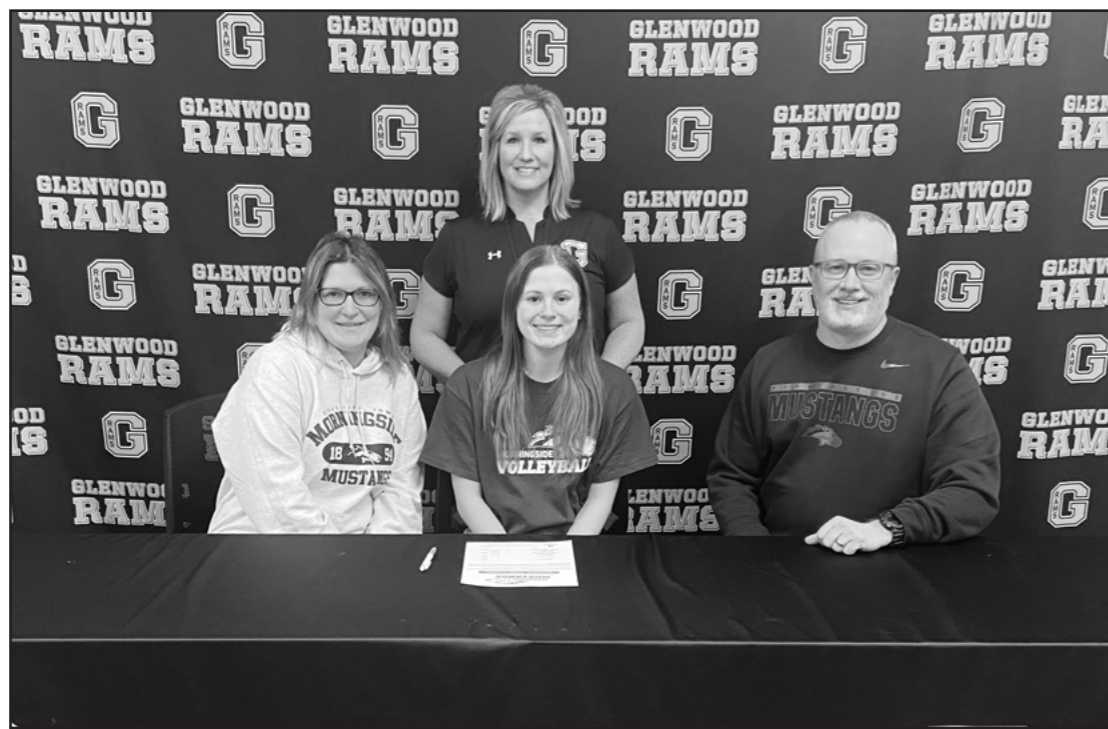

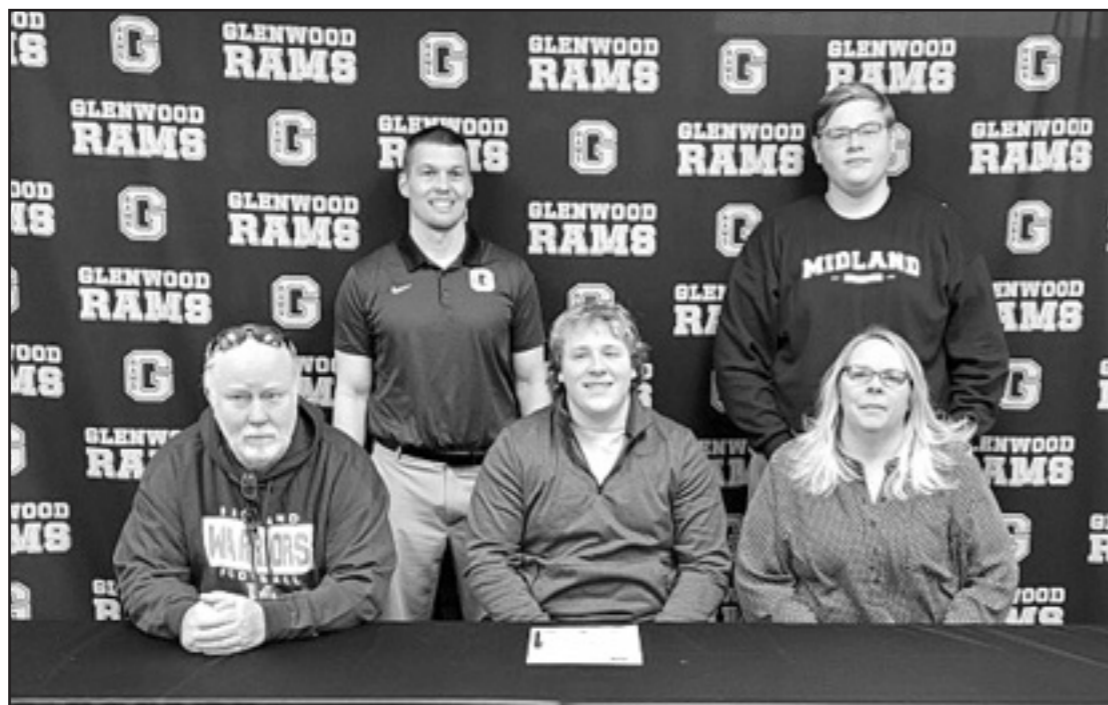

## Lundvall places second at IWCOA state

Emily Lundvall didn't know what to expect.

The Glenwood sophomore had missed nearly two months of wrestling this season with a back injury. Two weeks ago, she decided to give it a go. On the weekend of Jan. 22, she was competing at the Iowa Wrestling Coaches and Officials Association Girls State Wrestling Tournament in Coralville.

"I came into the tournament with the goal to get back on the mat but I didn't have any big goals," Lundvall said. "I just wanted to finish my match without much pain and I ended up being pretty motivated to be out there and doing how I did."

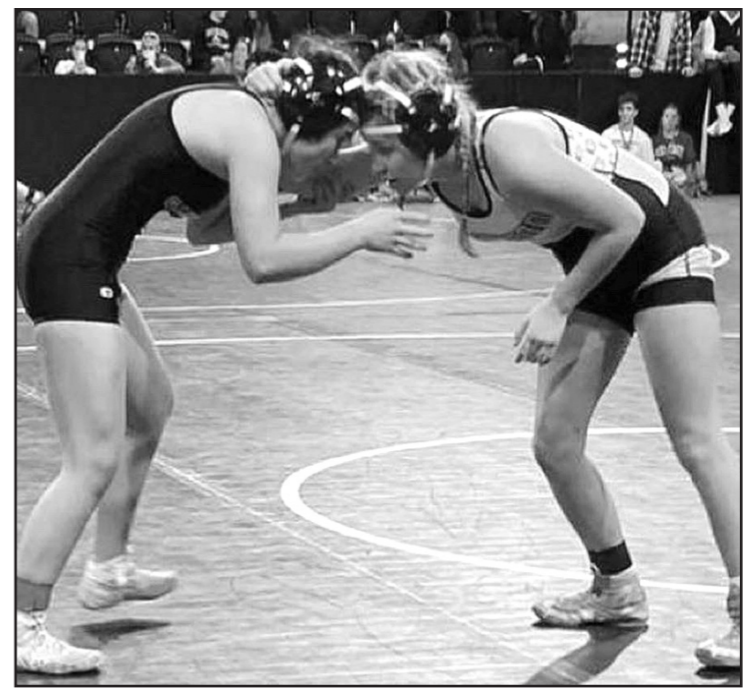
All Lundvall "did" was finish as the runner-up in her 125-pound silver weight division. A finish that surprised even Lundvall.

She got in just three matches prior to the state tournament.

"It was not fun taking that time off," she said. "When I came back I was to the point there wasn't anything (physically) wrong with me, I just needed to learn to deal with the pain. I was rusty and slow but I was moving around in less pain than I was."

It was hard to see that "rust" on the mat.

After receiving a first round bye, she pinned Mid-Prairie's Emil Harmston and Hadley Boshart of Gilbert to reach the finals. But a quick attack by Addy Appelhans of Anamosa was too much for Lundvall to overcome. She fell by first period pin.

"I wanted to get out there and do my best," Lundvall said, adding she was at first disappointed she was seeded into the lower, silver bracket. "I was bummed but it was nothing to be ashamed of. It was great to just be back and be able to wrestle in the first place."

This is Lundvall's second year wrestling. But the sport runs in the family. Both of her younger brothers have wrestled since they were young and dad Dane Lundvall won a state championship for Glenwood in 1995.

"I watched my brothers wrestle a lot and just decided I'd give it a shot last year," she said.

As a freshman last season, Lundvall won her first match at state before dropping her next two to finish outside the medal stand.

Lundvall was happy to learn she won't need surgery on her back. She plans to wrestle freestyle with Powerhouse Wrestling Club in Council Bluffs this off-season before joining the Rams' fledgling girls wrestling team. The Girls High School Athletic Union Board of Directors voted unanimously early this month to sanction girls wrestling as the organization's 11th sport. Competition will begin next season.

"I am very excited to see how our team can grow," Lundvall said. "I know a lot of girls probably don't go out because they don't want to wrestle boys but now that we're sanctioned I think we'll get a lot of girls and we'll have a good team. We have a chance to make history and I'm super excited to see how it goes."

"I would probably have predicted right there she was going to have this career to some degree at that age," he said. "She's been a pretty special basketball player for some time. She's always been really talented with the ball but in her high school career she's brought so many things to the game other than just shooting. She makes people around her better. She distributes the ball very well. She can play a lot of different roles and positions. She's so much more than just a knockdown shooter."

The 31-point night wasn't unusual for Camden, who is averaging a team-best 20.1 points per game this season. She's been on a scoring tear lately. She set a new single game scoring record Jan. 21 with a 40-point night against Red Oak.

"I have definitely felt good, we've been getting up a lot of shots at practice and I've been shooting a lot lately on my own, so I think that's paying off," she said.

Camden is also feeling better. She tore an ACL in her knee prior to her junior year but waited until last March to have surgery which kept her out of the first five games this season. While she still has some soreness the knee is "not nearly as bad as it was at the start of the season."

"It was very hard," she said of sitting out. "But my teammates were always supportive and told me it would be worth when I get to come back and play for the first time this season."

She scored 18 points in her first game back, a 66-45 win over Harlan. She also leads the Rams with 33 three-pointers.

Camden can't tell you where her first varsity points came. She can tell you she never quite imagined she would reach the scoring record although it was definitely a goal, she said.

"I didn't know if I'd reach it, but I was going to try," she said.

She's been playing basketball since kindergarten and was involved in volleyball and track before

focusing on rehab and basketball the last two seasons. She has signed with Peru State to play basketball next year. She loved the Bobcat coaches, the campus and the fact the program stuck with her following her injury.

"It (the injury) didn't seem to bother them whatsoever so that was nice," she said.

Knowing her name is going to be etched on the Rams' all-time records wall is "exciting," she said.

Assistant Coach Bryan Diekmann approached in the hallway the day after she broke the record and asked, "Do you feel any different today?"

"I said, 'A little bit. It's super exciting.'"

But Camden isn't planning to rest on her laurels. She and her Ram teammates are chasing bigger goals. Glenwood is currently ranked No. 1 in Class 4A and chasing their third straight state tournament trip. Last year's loss in the state

finals, Camden said, has been a big motivator this season.

"I feel really good with how things are going but every team always has something that they need to strive for, to work on getting better at as a team," she said. "We're working on playing more together as a team and showing up more on the defensive end. And communication. It's the little thing that can make us for sure be able to get back to where we were last year

Doryn Paup paced Creston with 26 points and 13 rebounds.

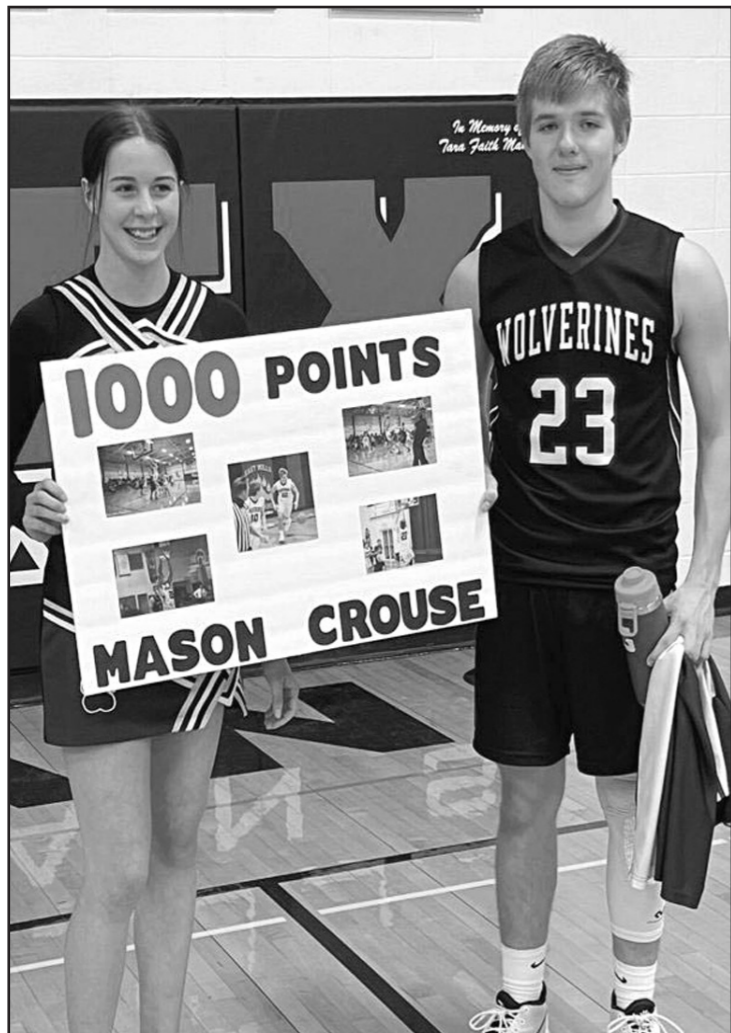

## Wolverines avenge earlier loss to Stanton

East Mills avenged a loss in the Corner Conference Tournament championship game and snapped Stanton's eight-game win streak with a 67-52 win last Tuesday.

After struggling to find their shooting touch in the championship loss three days earlier, the Wolverines (13-4 overall, 7-0 in the conference) shot 50 percent from the field (27-of-54) in the win.

"We started off pretty hot in the championship game and then bombed the next three quarters," said East Mills coach Kevin Schafer. "And we didn't have a bad quarter offensively Tuesday. Defensively we played well except for that third quarter

when they went crazy and (Carter) Johnson got hot."

The Wolverines built a 17-9 lead after a quarter and then extended that lead to 33-17 at the half.

But Stanton outscored East Mills 28-17 in the third quarter and cut the lead to two in the fourth quarter.

But that's as close as the Vikings would get. The Wolverines closed the game on a 15-7 run.

"They spent a lot of energy that third quarter and then they struggled to score in the fourth quarter," Schafer said. "I think a lot of that was how hard they had to play to make a run. Our kids just kept at it. We never had a bad quarter on offense and

Mason Crouse led three Wolverines in double-figures with 25 points. Braden West added 20 points and 10 rebounds and Davis McGrew chipped in 11 points and six rebounds.

Carter Johnson scored 27 points to lead Stanton.

Stanton outscored East Mills 22-6 in the fourth quarter to rally past the Wolverines 59-48 in Corner Conference girls basketball last Tuesday.

The Wolverines (13-4 overall, 6-2 in the conference) led 42-37 after three quarters but could not hold the lead.

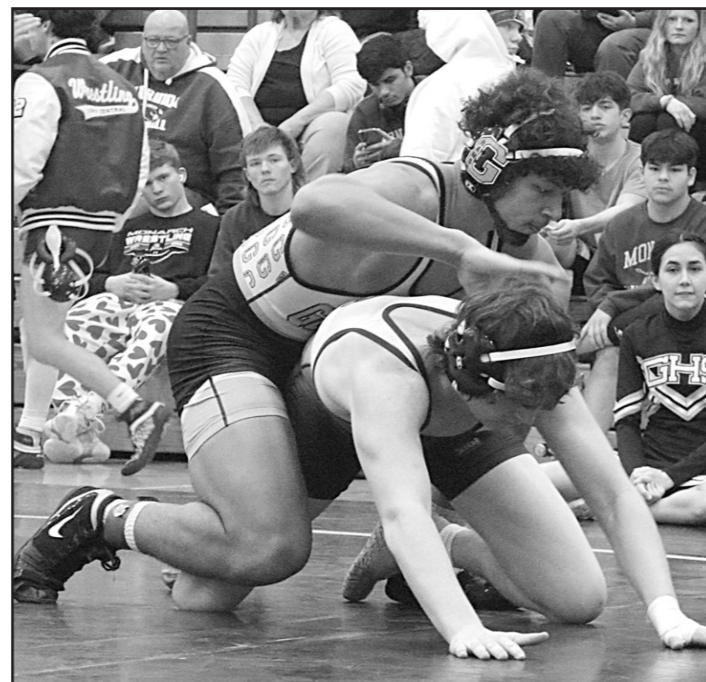
Reese Fauble (138 pounds), Kellan Scott (145), and Tyler Boldra (160) all earned third place medals.
