## Trick play dooms Wolverines in postseason loss

A trick play with less than a minute to go lifted Southeast Warren to a 38-32 win over East Mills in a wild Eight-player first round playoff game in Liberty Center Friday night.

The double-reverse pass play call that had quarterback Landon Harvey fling a 20-yard touchdown to Logan Montgomery capped a see-saw contest that saw the two teams combine for 44 points and four lead changes in the second half.

East Mills trailed 14-12 at the half but took the lead minutes into the second half on a 60-yard TD run by Ryan Stortenbecker. The teams would take their turns with the lead and the momentum the rest of the half.

Playing without starting quarterback Zach Thornburg, who missed the game due to injury, the Wolverines slid Stortenbecker under center. Seeing his first action under center since junior high the senior looked like a seasoned veteran. His 60-yard TD scamper a minute into the second half gave East Mills its first lead.

"We thought this might happen, so he practiced there this week," said East Mills co-head coach Kevin Schafer. "They were so much bigger than us, going to a pure run game, which would make sense if we had our running back and quarterback, wasn't an option. We spread it out and had four wide outs on most every play and he did a great job completing it into zones and we turned a lot of short passes into big gains."

East Mills appeared in control when

## Glenwood punches playoff ticket

Glenwood punched its ticket to the Class 4A state football playoffs with a convincing 44-14 win over Dallas Center Grimes Friday night in the regular season finale at Ram Memorial Field.

The Rams scored touchdowns on two of their first four offensive plays of the night and then pulled away in the second half to secure the win and one of 16 spots in the Class 4A playoff field. The 15-seeded Rams will play at Spencer, the No. 8 seed, Friday night.

Coach Cory Faust said the game was the biggest win of the year for the Rams and one of their best performances of the season.

"DCG's record is pretty deceiving. It's a lot bigger school, their record is pretty deceiving- they've got a good program," he said. "They're really hard to prepare for - they've got some good players so I'm really proud of our guys."

Payton Longmeyer set the tone for the Rams early when he returned the opening kickoff to the DCG 14 yard line. Quarterback Kaydon Anderson scrambled for a 13-yard touchdown run three plays later.

The Mustangs drove the ball into Glenwood territory on their first possession of the game but the drive ended when Cody Krause intercepted a Ty Mikkelsen pass in the red zone and returned it 36 yards to the Rams' 43 yard line. On the next play, Anderson teamed up with Longmeyer on a 57-yard touchdown pass.

A pass interception late in the first quarter put DCG in position to score its first touchdown of the night. Lane Nelsen returned the interception to the Glenwood 4 yard line, setting up a short TD run by Eli Carpenter.

The Mustangs tied the game with another touchdown on their next possession early in the second quarter. The 76-yard drive culminated with an 18-yard TD pass from Mikkelsen to Trevor Hamil.

The momentum DCG had built was short-lived, however. On Glenwood's next possession, Tate Mayberry raced 69 yards to give the Rams a first down on the Mustang 10 yard line. Two plays later, Casey Godbout found paydirt from four yards out to put the Rams up again.

Glenwood's lead increased to 24-14 in the final seconds of the half when Conner King booted a 44-yard field goal.

The Rams were dominant in the second half with Mayberry scoring on touchdown runs of 34 and 78 yards and Anderson hooking up with Krause on a 13-yard TD pass. The Ram defense flexed its muscle as well in the

final two quarters of the game - stopping the Mustangs and forcing a change of possession three times on fourth down.

Both teams substituted freely in the final minutes of the contest.

"That was one of our best games of the year," Faust said. "Both sides of the ball did a really nice job - we put together another game that was pretty complete, so that's good."

When the night was over, Glenwood had outyarded the Mustangs, 403-232. Mayberry finished his senior night with 235 yards rushing on 19 carries and Anderson passed for 139

## Rams returning to state cross country

For the second straight year the Glenwood boys' and girls' cross country team will compete at the Iowa State Cross Country meet.

Competing on their own Glenwood Lake Park course Thursday, the Ram boys dominated the field for the district title and the girls placed second to punch tickets to this week's state meet at Kennedy Park in Fort Dodge. The top three teams and the top 15 individual runners advance to state.

Just how dominant were the Glenwood boys?

All seven of head coach Todd Peverill's runners placed among the top 15 to qualify for state. Their team score of 30, was 53 points better than runner up Council Bluffs Lewis Central. The seven state qualifiers are a school record and Glenwood is

the lone team in believed to be the lone team in the state to qualify all of its district runners.

"Just wow," is how Peverill summed up his performance. "It's never happened at Glenwood, but Dallas Center-Grimes did it here a few years ago but never Glenwood."

Peverill said he could see his team's confidence building heading into the Hawkeye 10 Conference meet. That confidence carried over into the state qualifier.

"We knew we could do well, and I sat down with them and showed each of them what they were doing each meet and I told them they've plateaued, and they're due to cut some major time off. We did that. We ran fast. Every one of them cut 24 to 32 seconds off their best times. It was incredible.

The Titans' Ethan Eichhorn edged the Rams' Bryant Keller by three seconds for first place, but Keller wasn't alone among the top

finishers. Keller's time of 15:39 was a personal best and he was followed closely by teammates Andrew Smith in second, Liam Hays in fourth and Kevin Coots in ninth.

"That's flying," Peverill said of Keller's time. "(Former Ram star) Johnny Fuller didn't run that fast on this course if that tells you what kind of performance that was. I knew he'd break 16 but he hung with Eichhorn the whole way and was dead on running it perfect while Eichhorn was a little too wide."

Peverill said Keller has a legitimate shot at a top three finish at state.

As good as Keller, Smith and Hays ran, it was the running of Preston Slayman (12th), Dillon Anderson (13th), and Jackson Griffin (15th) that was the clincher for the Rams. They will be big factors if the Rams are to take that next step and reach their

ultimate goal: the school's first cross country state title.

"They're the key to the whole thing if we're going to win it," Peverill said. "Bryant and Andrew and Liam are going to do their thing to set us up but it's those other guys who can put it away for us. Pella is deep too, and West Polk has been ranked second all year, but I don't think they have our depth."

The Glenwood girls' squad finished second to Adel-DeSoto-Minburn in the team scores, 49 to 64. Led by Geneva Timmerman's blistering time of 17:59, 57 seconds

yards. Longmeyer was his top target, hauling in three passes for 67 yards. Krause netted 60 yards receiving on three catches.

Defensively, Krause led the Rams with five solo tackles and three assisted. Kellan Scott had four solo and two assisted tackles.

Glenwood finished the regular season with a 6-3 overall record and the runner-up in District 6 behind undefeated Council Bluffs Lewis Central. Getting to the postseason was a goal the Rams had set early on in the season.

“Check that goal off there. That’s a big landmark,” Faust said. “I’m proud of these seniors – I’m happy for them. It’s been a rough year with a lot of injuries and tough competition and stuff like that. They kept battling and they earned this playoff spot.”

Spencer brings a 7-2 record into Friday night’s match-up. The winner will advance to a second-round contest against either Le-Mars or Lewis Central.

Faust said he expects the Rams to make a strong showing Friday night against the Tigers.

“We’re getting some people healthy and hoping to get another couple guys back next week,” he said. “If we prepare hard and play well, I know we can compete with anybody. We’ve played some really tough teams already.”

Glenwood Playoff Preview  
Glenwood (6-3) at Spencer (7-2)

**Notes:** Glenwood will head out on the road in its first state playoff appearance since the 2020-2021 season and face Spencer in a Class 4A opening round tilt. The Tigers, coming off a 35-7 rout of Storm Lake in their season finale, run a unique, run-based “flexbone” that runs it 80 percent of the time while utilizing three running backs on almost every down. It’s an offense Glenwood hasn’t seen this season but is similar to a scheme the Rams ran from 2012 to 2017. In all, Spencer has run the ball on 450 of their 512 offense snaps while averaging 277 yards per game on the ground and 33.5 points per game. The ground game is led by Adam Carillo’s 1,032 yards and nine TDs and quarterback Riley DeWitt’s 637 yards rushing and 16 TDs. Glenwood’s counters with a spread offense that has averaged 362 yards and

36.4 points per game against one of the toughest schedules in Class 4A. Quarterback Kayden Anderson lead the charge with 1,861 yards passing and 22 TD passes. Tate Mayberry is the top back having rushed for 643 yards and eight TDs.

**History:** The two programs are not without history. They met in the 1994 Class 3A semifinals in an epic, four overtime 17-14 Spencer victory on the Tigers’ home turf.

**Glenwood coach Cory Faust:** “They are a fundamentally sound team in all 3 phases and their players play hard. Everyone is good at this time of year. I’m excited to see what our team can do. We’ve been getting more healthy and continuing to improve.”

## Knights hold off Moravia rally in 44-38 victory

Fremont-Mills used its powerful run game to build a 26-point lead and they relied on its defense late in a 44-38 victory over Moravia in the Eight-player playoffs opening round in Tabor Friday.

The Knights (7-2) ran all over the Moravia through first half and into third quarter, taking a 38-12 with a quarter and a half of football to play. But the Mohawks, who entered averaging better than 220 yards passing per game, adjusted on offense and that confidence carried over to their defense.

“The first half we were able to kind of do what we wanted,” said Fremont-Mills coach Greg Ernster. “They were lined up in their traditional defense and we were able to run right at it. After halftime we got pretty conservative and their defense adjusted and stacked the box and their offense is explosive.

“Our plan was the milk the clock and keep their offense off the field and they did a really good job of getting guys open and making plays.”

Moravia quarterback Shane Heimick engineered six touchdown drives in the final 17 minutes. His fourth touchdown pass of the game, a 44-yarder to Jackson McDaniel, cut the Knights lead to six with under two minutes to go. The Mohawks’ inside kick on the ensuing kick off was recovered by the Knights to end the game.

“They chuck it around,” Ernster said of the Mohawks offense. “They have a top five quarterback and top five receiver in the state but our coverage against them once they started moving that receiver around more in motion put our defense in a pickle. They found some one on ones against our guys and that made their offense run.”

Heimick had a day for the Mohawks. He threw for 366 yards and those four TDs and ran for 76 yards and two more scores.

But it was the Knights’ ground game that proved to be the difference. Their 397 yards were a season-high. Braxton Blackburn led the way with 176 yards and two TDs. Payten VanHouten added 92 yards and a TD and quarterback Taylor Reed ran for 94 yards and tossed three touchdown passes to Paxten VanHouten.

“The majority of that was the first half,” Ernster said of his team’s rushing night, adding his team had two big drives the final two quarter but the didn’t haven the explosiveness of the first half when they snapped off three 50-plus yard plays.

With the win, the Knights advance to play at Southeast Warren in Friday’s second round. The Warhawks escaped a wild, back-and-forth meeting with East Mills last Friday 38-32.

Ernster has a good idea what Southeast Warren has in store for his team.

“We have a great idea of what they want to do because they look a lot like us,” Ernster said. “They’re very similar to us and to Lenox, they’re going to go to double tight ends and run, run, run and they’re going to throw it over your head. They rarely like to spread it out so we’re going to have to make sure we’re prepared for when they do try to go play-action pass. We have to make sure we do our assignments first. They’re a very good football team.”

Kickoff in Friday’s second round game is set for 7 p.m. in Liberty Center.

## Ram volleyball season ends in regional opener

Sergeant Bluff-Luton’s experience and a heavy dose of outside hitter Alex Trover were too much for Glenwood in the Class 4A, Region 1 first round last Tuesday in Glenwood.

The Warriors aggressive attack carried them to a 25-20, 25-22, 25-13 win to end the Rams season with a record of 17-27 overall. This is first non-winning season for Glenwood since the 2016-17 season

Glenwood coach Paula Carman had a long emotional talk with her team following the match. All agreed the three-set loss didn’t do justice to the progress the team has made this season in what has been admittedly a “rebuilding” year for the program coming off three straight 30-win seasons.

“Inexperience has been a black cloud for us this year and we knew that” Carman said of her team that lists just one senior on its roster. “That big word rebuilding has been hovering over us all year. But the thing is we have a lot of experienced players who have played a lot of volleyball. We struggled with leadership more than anything this year. That vocal, confident person to get things done for us out there. Not that we didn’t fight, not that people didn’t give a 110 percent.”

Trover was active earlier for the Warriors. She had five of her game-high 16 kills in the first set. But as the match went on, Carman said her team got better.

“We adjusted,” she said. “The first few points of the game No. 10 (Trover) swung big, and I think once we got her timing down and figured things out a little bit defense starting filling in the zones

she was hitting, they were fighting and doing what we needed to do. I felt like once we started pushing and putting the ball back at Sergeant Bluff, we were keeping them out of system, and they were making mistakes, but we just didn’t go it enough.”

The Rams did find those spots in the second set and led for much of the match, including at 19-16 before the Warriors made an adjustment of their own. They rattled off six straight points and Glenwood never seemed to recover, in the set or the match.

“That was a big turning point,” Carman said. “They got three straight points, and it took us completely out and there’s that lack of experience that showed in our ef-

fort. It was big. We came for that third set, and you could see the long faces and I told them, ‘We’re right there, keep fighting.’”

The Rams finished with 24 kills on the night. The Warriors tallied 39 at a .238 clip.

“At the beginning our hitters were super overanxious, they were going on motor and not really thinking,” she said. “Our big word today was to be aggressive because we have a tendency when we’re maybe not feeling it to tipping and we’re not going to win that match. We’ve been really pressing the girls that they need to be aggressive and swing and find their spots on the floor.”

Maddie Roenfeld and Arnold led Glenwood with six kills each.

Stortenbecker connected with Mason Crouse on his fourth TD grab of the game to go ahead 32-26 with just over two minutes to go. But the Warhawks put together two quick TD drives, sandwiched around a stop on defense, to ice the win.

The Wolverines had two chances at a potential game-winning drive the last 50 seconds but turned it over both times. They fumbled the ball away on the ensuing possession and then used a stop on defense and their timeouts to get the ball back with less than 20 seconds left only to see Stortenbecker’s Hail Mary intercepted.

“We had the ball on our side of the field with no timeouts and a quarterback that hadn’t ever been in that situation. It wasn’t ideal for a comeback. But it looked like Mason (Crouse) had a little bit of an opening and he had beaten his man, but they had a safety about 25 yards back and he was about a 6-foot-2 kid and he came over and picked it.”

Defensively, the Wolverines held Southeast Warren in check on the ground. They finished with 155 yards rushing but averaged just 3.7 yards per game. It was the passing

game and the scrambling of Harvey that proved the difference.

“We sold out to stop the run and we did a good job of stopping what they wanted to do, which was power football, by getting stops and making them go for it on fourth down,” Schafer said. “They burned us on some play action,

which we were afraid of. When you’re selling out that much sometimes that’s going to happen. Their quarterback, for being a running team, was an excellent thrower. They just don’t ask him to do it much. But when he did throw, he was very good.”

Harvey finished 12-of-16 pass-

“She did exactly what we needed her to do, she was swinging big and making things happen,” she said. “She went wide a few times, but her effort was phenomenal.”

Carman admits the Rams’ 17-27 record isn’t what she or her team hoped for. And it certainly doesn’t reflect the team’s improvement from August to now.

“A lot of girls that I don’t think were expecting playing time this year got some,” Carman said. “When you put a freshman and a whole lot of sophomores and some juniors who haven’t seen a lot of varsities playing time, there was very little varsity experience. So, when you take that from last season to where we’ve been at, I know it doesn’t look like it in the scores and I know not everybody that comes and watches sees it, but there’s been a lot of work done this year. The players grew immensely even if the scores don’t show it.”

The future does certainly look bright for the Rams. All but one senior – starting libero Delaney Holeten – will return next year, as will injured sophomore hitter Charley Hernandez who missed most of the season with a knee injury.

“This group right here, and I don’t think they’ve processed this, is the culture of this program now,” Carman said. “It got put to them on with the losses to graduation and I think they came in and thought ‘We get to play,’ and so there needs to be more of a focal point on how to be a leader effectively and continuously along with communication will help players.

“These kids, how they practice, how they play, how the treat each other, is going to determine where we go from here.”

Virtual program offered for adult children supporting aging parents

When Mom is taking care of Dad or another loved one, who takes care of Mom? Iowa State University Extension and Outreach is offering "Caregiving Relationships: Conversations on Aging" to help adult children gain the skills they need to support their aging, caregiving parents.

The virtual workshop will be held via Zoom on Monday, Nov. 7 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. There is no cost to participate, but registration is required. To register or find more information, visit <https://go.iastate.edu/RVDOQQ>.

November is National Family Caregivers Month — a time to recognize and honor those who care for an adult with a chronic condition, as well as those who care for a child, teen or adult child with special health or behavioral needs, said Malisa Rader, a human sciences specialist in family wellbeing with ISU Extension and Outreach.

Family caregivers are unpaid family members, friends or neighbors who assist those who need help. More than 1 in 5 Americans — 53 million people — are providing unpaid care for someone with health or functional needs, according to Caregiving in the U.S. 2020, a research survey conducted every five years by the National Alliance for Caregiving and AARP.

"My mom took care of my dad in his last years. He suffered from dementia and tended to wander. As a family caregiver, my mom made challenging decisions and her daily routine changed dramatically," noted an adult daughter who participated in "Caregiving Relationships: Conversations on Aging."

Research shows that spousal caregivers are more likely to provide care with help from adult children than to accept

help from community supports or nonfamily members. "You are a son or daughter to your parents regardless of age, but your role description can change when your parent is in the role of a caregiver," explained Rader. "Your parent is in a new role when helping a spouse with things they cannot do because of a medical condition's disabling effects. You can learn how to better support your parent

during this time," Rader said. "Caregiving Relationships: Conversations on Aging" helps adult children learn to recognize how caregiving affects relationships.

"The program helps them discover their role in making decisions about their parents' later life," said Rader.
