# Costello receives heavy criticism for private school voucher vote

Passage of legislation that gives tax dollars to Iowa parents who send their children to private schools dominated the discussion at Saturday's legislative coffee at Glenwood City Hall.

Republican State Sen. Mark Costello and Republican State Rep. David Sieck took part in the forum.

The controversial legislation that provides parents with nearly \$7,600 per child to cover private school expenses was a priority for Gov. Kim Reynolds. The measure passed in both houses of the legislature in January, just weeks after the start of the 2023 session. Costello voted in favor of the bill while Sieck voted "No" against the wishes of Reynolds and his party.

Several members of the audience voiced their displeasure with Costello for his vote on the legislation and other Republican-backed bills they consider to be harmful to public education and children.

Amy Stickrod gave a lengthy address, noting that the private school vouchers will cost Iowa taxpayers \$900 million over the next four years and \$345 million after that. She reminded Costello that the vast majority of Iowans opposed the legislation according to multiple polls and communication sent to state legislators.

"It would seem to me, Mr. Costello, that you have forgotten

who you work for," she said. "You didn't vote in the interest of the vast majority of your constituents. You don't work for Governor Reynolds, Betsy DeVos or Americans For Prosperity (the organization started by the Koch brothers). You work for us.

"You have underfunded public schools for a decade. Then you complain about public schools. You demonize and vilify public school teachers. Then, you push for and legalize vouchers in an area that has few private schools. Who can blame teachers for wanting to leave the state or the profession entirely?" Costello responded to criticism from Stickrod and others in the audience.

"Ultimately, this is about choice and letting parents choose where they send their children," he said. "I think parents should have a choice. I think it's a reasonable bill. I think

it was actually well thought out, well written and I was glad to vote for it."

Costello said the average annual cost to fund a public school student in Iowa is \$17,000.

"If every student in the state went to a private school, it would save the whole state over \$1 billion," he said.

Costello did not address concerns expressed in the audience about the lack of transparency and accountability for private schools once the funds are received from parents.

Sieck said he voted against the legislation because he made a promise to constituents to support public schools when first elected.

Some other issues discussed at the forum included levee accreditation, the lack of options for families of Glenwood Resource Center clients to find a new home for their loved ones and ownership of Iowa farmland by foreign companies.

The auditor's office will be open extended hours on Friday, March 3, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mailed-in absentee ballots must be received at the auditor's office before 8 p.m. on Tuesday, March 7. Ballots cannot be placed in the drop box outside the county courthouse.

# Concrete company doesn't appear before county BOA

Two hours before the scheduled start of the Feb. 21 Mills County Zoning Board of Adjustment meeting, a representative of Iowa / Nebraska Concrete Co. notified Mills County Zoning Administrator Holly Jackson that officials from the company would not be attending the meeting to discuss their application for a conditional use permit to build a permanent concrete batch plant on 180th Street, south of Highway 34.

The application was filed two days after the Mills County Planning and Zoning Commission tabled a proposed zoning amendment from Corridor Overlay to Highway Oriented Commercial Zoning that would allow construction and

operation of the plant on the 30-acre site.

The matter was tabled by the commission after several residents of the area voiced opposition to having the plant at that location.

Jackson said several people with concerns and questions about the plant also attended the Board of Adjustment meeting, anticipating the conditional use permit to be addressed. Written questions have been forwarded to company officials, who have requested they have the right to appear regarding the matter at the board's March meeting.

The matter could be addressed by both the Planning and Zoning Commission and Board of Adjustment on March 21 when their monthly meetings will run back-to-back at the Mills County Annex building in Glenwood.

Three people hospitalized following pair of accidents Friday in Mills County

Three people were hospitalized in a pair of accidents in western Mills County on Friday.

The first accident occurred shortly after 6:30 a.m. on Highway 34 near Pacific Junction. According to a report from the Iowa State Patrol, a 2008 Honda Civic driven by Felix Ngala, 59, of Bellevue, Neb., was westbound on Highway 34 at the 5 mile marker when the driver lost control of the vehicle, which slid across the median into the eastbound lane. Ngala's vehicle struck an eastbound semi

truck driven by David Sroggins, 63, of Red Oak.

Ngala's vehicle came to rest upright facing north in the left eastbound lane while Scroggins' vehicle came to rest upright facing east in the south ditch. After being extricated from the Honda by rescue personnel, Ngala and a passenger, 46-year-old Elizabeth Yensa of Bellevue, were transported by Glenwood and Silver City Rescue to Bergan Mercy Hospital in Omaha for treatment of multiple injuries. No updates on their condition have been provided.

The second accident occurred on Interstate 29.

indicated a 60-year-old woman from Pacific Junction, Sharon Kay Stewart, suffered a medical condition while driving south on I-29 around 5:30 p.m.

Authorities said her vehicle went off the road near Pacific Junction, crashed into the cable barrier several times and traveled down the median for about a mile before coming to a stop.

Troopers said a witness pulled the driver from the car and began life-saving measures. Glenwood Rescue responded and transported Stewart to Mercy Medical Center in Council Bluffs with CPR in progress.

No reports concerning her condition have been released.



## Sports betting bringing in the bucks

I'm not surprised that sports betting in Iowa has been generating a significant amount of revenue for the state, but I have to admit even I was somewhat taken back by the numbers regarding the matter shared by our state representative David Sieck in a recent newsletter.

Sieck noted that when sports wagering was enacted in 2019, the Legislative Services Agency put out a report outlining the financial impact passage of the bill would likely have on the state of Iowa.

It was estimated that the amount of sports wagering in the state would range from \$186 million to \$560 million annually. The 6.75% tax on the net receipts for sports betting was expected to generate between \$630,000 and \$1.8 million annually for the state of Iowa.

When combined with the dollars generated for the state by the legalization of internet fantasy sports wagering (Draft Kings, etc.), Iowa's annual take from the new forms of gambling was expected to range from \$900,000 to \$2.6 million annually.

Legalized sports wagering became legal in the state prior to the start of the 2019 college football season.

For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the state collected \$1.8 million in sports wagering tax.

number considering that betting on sports wasn't legal until August and the pandemic hit in March (2020), shutting down most sporting events for months," Sieck noted.

Yes, those were indeed some strong numbers considering COVID wiped out the final four months of FY 2020 and forced the cancellation of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, one of the most popular sports betting events in our country.

As impressive as the first year's numbers were, look what happened in FY 2021,

when sports activities started returning to "normal." Sports wagering tax collections in Iowa shot up to \$6.1 million.

In Fiscal Year 2022, the sports wagering tax payments totaled \$9.585 million. I'm not a math guy, but I'll trust Sieck when he says it was growth of 58 percent for the year.

So, how about this year? "Through January 2023, \$1.381 billion has been wagered through Iowa casinos on sporting events," Sieck said. "As for tax collections on those wagers, the state has received \$8.365 million. This puts FY 2023 collections 41.8% ahead of the collections through January 2022."

Wow! It clear, Iowa's getting a lot of bang for the betting buck and I think we can say sports wagering has been a winning bet for the state.

## Congress needs to tackle the middlemen

As a Republican-controlled House of Representatives with a small majority opened for business in January, one member had especially big ideas for saving patients money on prescription drug costs - and the research to back it up.

A year ago, Rep. James Comer (R-KY) released a comprehensive report on the role of pharmacy benefit managers in the nation's healthcare system. The result does not make for pleasant reading. It is largely a tale of how greedy middlemen have taken advantage of existing legal loopholes and lax oversight to create an industry that raked in \$28 billion in profits in 2019 - while providing

no actual healthcare to patients.

Insurers use pharmacy benefit managers to negotiate with drug makers on terms for the inclusion of medications in insurance plan coverage. In fact, however, the three biggest PBMs, which account for nearly 80 percent of prescription claims, are co-owned alongside respective massive insurers like Cigna and pharmacy behemoths like CVS Caremark. The result is an interlocking daisy chain for extracting maximum profit from consumers and payers such as employers and federal and state governments - all while deflecting blame for increasing drug costs away from themselves and onto drug makers.

There's evidence that to remain competitive with PBMs, drug makers have set list prices higher in expectation of large forthcoming discounts -- a move that passes none of the discounts directly to patients but allows PBMs to extract increased revenue for their bottom line.

Insurers, meanwhile, charge coinsurance payments and count toward deductibles patient out-of-pocket costs based on the list price of the medication - not the discounted price the insurers actually pay. Insurers like this arrangement just fine because it allows them to crank up their own revenue without raising premiums.

Insurers and their PBMs also pressure consumers to

obtain medications through their own respective pharmacy groups.

Altogether, this conduct has become so parasitic that more than 50% of each dollar spent on brand-name medicines now goes to middlemen entities.

If lawmakers and regulators at the Federal Trade Commission and elsewhere were doing their jobs, this would all be illegal and patients would save big. Instead, many lawmakers have been happy to look the other way while pointing a finger at "Big Pharma" and pocketing campaign contributions from PBMs and allied grifters.

Consumers deserve to know who's paying what to whom for prescription drugs.

housing, meals and medical care.

Oe woman, Martha, from New York City is hired to be the camp director, working with the American military there. She flees an abusive marriage.

The second woman, Kitty, is originally from Austria, but shipped to England by her Jewish parents before the war, and wants to see if her parents survived the carnage.

The third woman, Delphine, from Paris, takes the job to heal her heartbreak over losing her doctor husband and son at Dachau. She uses her medical training to work in the camp hospital.

The story is gripping and there is no stopping place (good-bye meals and sleep.)

## To Forgive, Or Not

I have discovered that it is much easier to forgive your friends than your siblings. It's even much easier to forgive strangers and my enemies than my own siblings. When I think back on my childhood, I can remember being mad at my brothers and sisters, which seemed like most of the time. They were constantly bugging me, always getting into my things, and making me angry.

There was a time when my youngest brother was a toddler that he actually ate my homework. I didn't need to blame it on the family dog. And then there was the time when all I got for Christmas was a toy dump truck and my older brother took it to play with and left it in the park for some kid to find. Then there were those bites I sustained when my baby sister didn't like me telling her not to do something.

So how did I retaliate? Instinctively, of course, as any enraged sibling would do, I shouted at them and if my parents weren't around, I'd hit or threaten to hit them. It would take us most of the day, or going off to

bed at night, to cool down. And then, as any good parents would do, they had us say things like, "I'm sorry," and "I forgive you." Sometimes whenever I hesitated and didn't forgive them right away they would cry or scream, "Allen didn't forgive me!"

As we grew older we became more tolerant of each other and didn't get into as many squabbles. Our fighting and squabbles gave way to irritations, such as interrupting each other, being too noisy when we were attempting to listen to our favorite radio show (we didn't have a TV), or just saying things we knew would bug each other.

Now that I am older and don't have ready access to my siblings, they can't see my stares when I get upset with them.

Today, when people do bad things that cause me to become angry, I approach from an informed perspective. Over the years I have been taught things like Alexander Pope said, "To err is human; to forgive, divine." And, "If you do not forgive men (including siblings), neither will your Father forgive your offenses" (Matt. 6:15).

The one verse that gives me some trouble is the one that says, "And to the one who strikes you on the cheek, offer him the other one also" (Luke 6:29). Sometimes I feel as though I have offered all four of my cheeks. But I'll continue to offer them and try harder not to think or say unkind things about people, and say a prayer for them instead, including my siblings.
