IHSAA releases 2023, 2024 football schedules

Fremont-Mills will travel to West Des Moines as part of the "Battle of the Valley Classic" to open the 2023 football season.

The Iowa High School Athletic Association announced the schedules for the 2023 and 2024 football seasons last week. District and group assignments were posted in March following approval of the IHSAA's Board of Control. The 2023 football season will be the first with a socioeconomic factor added for football classifications. Approved this winter by the state board of education, the classification adjustment will reduce 40 percent of a school's free or reduced lunch (FRL) count from their annual enrollment to determine their final classification number.

Class 5A uses a "success model" for its group format and regular season scheduling.

Schools in 2A, 1A, A, and 8-player that do not qualify for the postseason may schedule a ninth game if they desire.

Regular season football schedules are determined by the IHSAA. Regular season

schedules for all other IHSAA sports are determined by member schools and their conferences.

Districts and groups are assigned by the IHSAA, then schools select preferred non-district opponents and submit them to IHSAA through a priority list. The IHSAA does make efforts to align schedules with as many priority list schedule selections as possible, however, opponents and availability were not guaranteed.

Glenwood opens its season hosting Sioux City East Aug. 25. The Rams' schedule includes three playoff teams from a year ago, including Class 3A state champion Harlan and Class 4A state runner up Council Bluffs Lewis Central.

"I believe we'll play one of the most competitive schedules in the state again the next two years," said Glenwood coach Cory Faust. "We love the challenge, and I'm excited to see how high our players can rise to the occasion."

The Rams reached the state quarterfinals a year ago while finishing with a record of 7-4.

Fremont-Mills reached the state quarterfinals a year ago. They will begin the season Saturday, Aug. 26 at Valley Stadium at West Des Moines

Glenwood wins own Ram Relays

Glenwood topped the field at its own Girls Ram Relays Thursday at the Glenwood Activities Complex.

The Rams won three events but placed in the top three in eight other events to compile 136 points. Atlantic was the runner-up with 113.33 points followed by Council Bluff Abraham Lincoln with 78 points for third.

"This was a meet loaded with talent, by far the most competitive we've had so far this year," said Glenwood coach Jordan Bueltel. "Our goal every meet is to get out there and compete and between the weather and the other athletes at this meet it took a full team effort to be able to win the team title. We won three events, which is great, but in meets with this much talent every place helps add to the point total and it took all of the girls for us to pull it out."

Brooklyn Schultz picked up a gold in the 200-meters and Lauren Hughes in the 800 while the Rams' 4x200 meter relay team of Zoie Carda, Koontz, Danika Arnold and Jenna Hopp placed first with a time of 1:48.75.

Koontz (100-meter dash), Jaylynn Floyd (high jump), and the Rams' 4x400 and 4x100-meter relays were second.

The Rams set seasons best in both the 4x100 and 4x200.

"The girls really went out and competed great throughout the lineup and we have so many girls that are starting to set PRs (personal records) and are getting real close. I am excited to see how the last month or so of this season progresses and see what these girls can accomplish," Bueltel said.

Rams' sprint medley relay medals at Kansas Relays

Glenwood's sprint medley team finished sixth out of 26 teams at this weekend's Kansas Relays at the University of Kansas in Lawrence, Kan.

"It's always a nice opportunity to qualify for big meets like Kansas Relays," Starnier said. "The opportunity to run against different opponents in a big feel type meet is really worth attending."

While the Rams qualified in four events in Kansas – Anthony Driscoll-Lee in the 110-meter hurdles, the 4x100-meter, 4x400-meter and the 1600m distance medley relays – and didn't better their times in any of them, Starnier said his team wasn't far off.

The weather was warm and windy on Friday and severe weather hit just before the Rams were to run the 4x400 and the meet was postponed to Saturday afternoon.

"Our initial plan was just to run Friday and then head back home after the 4x400 and go with the rest of our team to Sioux City Relays on Saturday," Starnier said. But with that meet ending up being cancelled, the Rams decided to stay in Lawrence and run the distance medley and the 4x400-meter relays on Saturday.

"We ran the DMR early Saturday morning, and the weather wasn't too bad," Starnier said. But following that event the weather turned and the remainder of the meet was cancelled.

"I give it to our kids, as it's not easy to sit and wait for your next event when it's hours away," Starnier said. That much time between events and then having to deal with the weather conditions. I'm proud of our kids in their ability to adapt and stay the course when they easily could have checked it in and said let's just go home.

"Hopefully we'll be better for this experience and be able to utilize what we've learned and apply to a critical situation down the road.

Glenwood fifth at CB Invite

The Glenwood boys placed fifth in the team standings at the seventh annual Council Bluffs Boys Track Invitational Thursday at the Gale Wickersham Athletic Complex in Council Bluffs.

Southeast Polk was the team champion with 133 points. The Rams won on event and placed top three in four other events to finish with 72 points and fifth place.

Glenwood coach Mark Starnier called the meet "loaded" with talented teams.

"Not only on the sure number of teams, but also the quality of teams," he said. "We limited most of our athletes to just two events and left some events open that didn't help our overall team placement. Our emphasis wasn't to score the most team points possible, as it was more so to get quality events and improve on performances that could potentially help us get closer

to qualifying for Drake."

Bryant Keller won the 1,600-meters and just missed out on gold in the 3,200-meters, placing second to champion Treyton Schaapherder by .06 of a second. Keller's time of 4:29.19 was a personal best and came close to meet record.

"Despite the continued windy conditions, Bryant ran an extremely gutsy race and left everything on the track," Starnier said. "He's an extremely hard worker and competitor. When Bryant runs, you know you're going to always get his best and he's improving with each meet. Once the wind dies down, Bryant is going to drop a lot of all of his long-distance events."

Anthony Driscoll-Lee added a second-place finish in the 110-meter hurdles while Jake Shannon (800-meter) and the Rams' distance medley relay placed third. Shannon's time was personal best.
