

Rams sweep at Woodbine's Rodney Smith invite

WOODBINE - The Glenwood girls and boys track and field teams swept the team titles at Woodbine's Rodney Smith Invitational Tuesday.

The Glenwood girls collected 10 gold medals and easily outpaced the field with 191.5 points. The Ram boys' squad picked up seven gold medals and 164 points to runner-up West Monona's 64 points.

Glenwood girls coach Jordan Bueltel said it was nice to finally get his whole team outside and competing.

"I think overall we ran pretty well, and we are really happy with where we are at right now but there is plenty of room for us to get better," he said.

Bueltel said Madelyn Berglund had a particularly nice meet, winning the 3000-meters and placing second in the 1500.

"We are excited to see how she continues to improve," Bueltel said.

Bueltel also commended the running of

his sprint relay teams. The Rams' 4x100, 4x200 and spring medleys all one gold and were led off Zoie Carda.

Brynlee Arnold added a first place showing in the discus and fourth in the shot. Carlie Clemmer (100-meter hurdles),

Abby Hughes (400-meter hurdles) and Charley Hernandez (long jump) all added gold medal finishes.

"Really I could list about everyone and find positives for the first meet," Bueltel said. "Again, we were really impressed overall and for a first meet we are really excited about where we are, now we just need to focus on getting

better."

The Glenwood boys notched seven gold medals and placed in the top three in six other events. Coach Mark Starner called his team's performance "not bad start to the outdoor season."

"We were just pleased to be

Brock Sell won the 100-meters, finished second in the 200-meters and anchored the 4x200-meter relay to gold to secure the Male Athlete of the Meet Award.

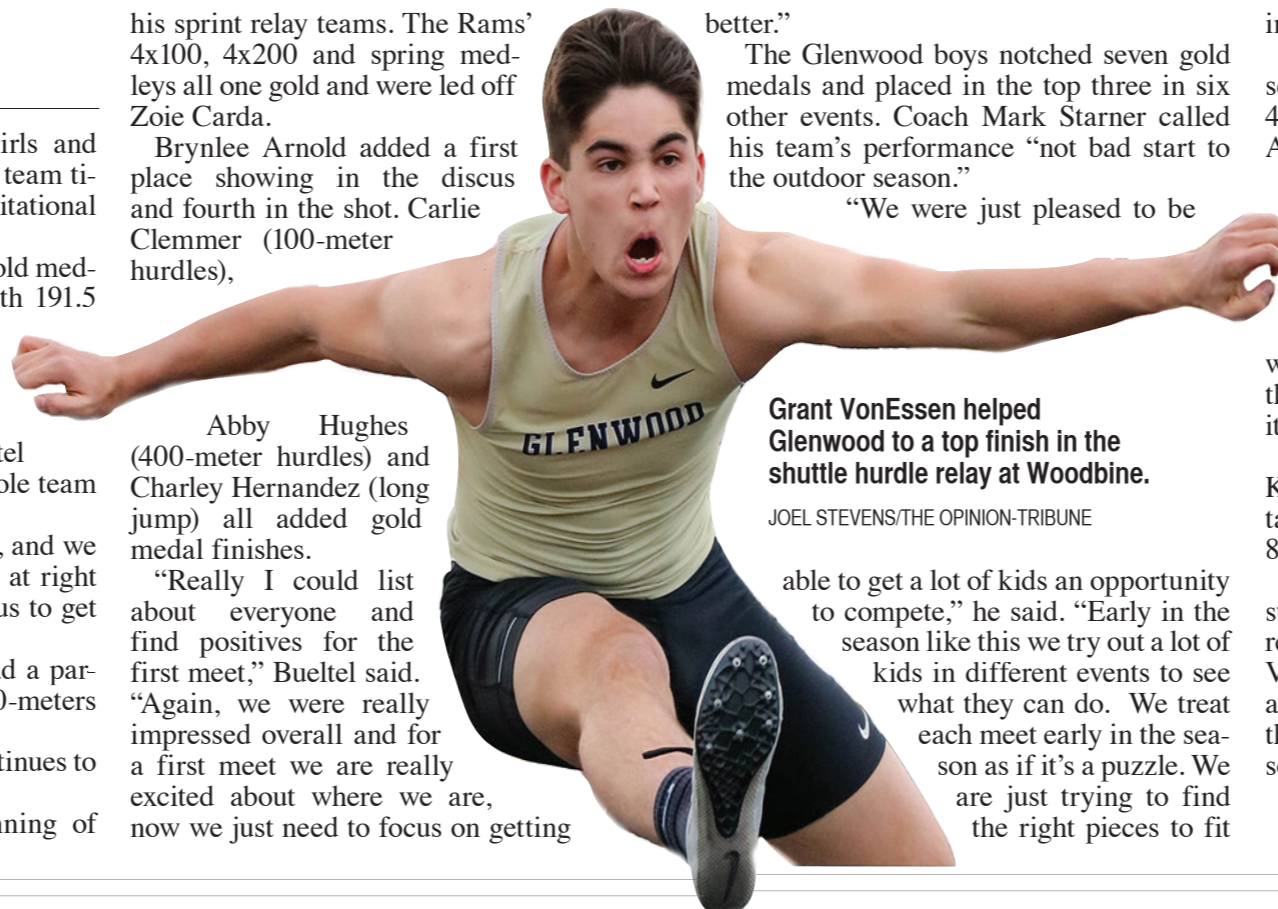
The Rams' Tyler Boldra was a part of three gold medals in Woodbine. The senior won the 400-meter hurdles and ran a leg on the gold medal winning 4x200-meter and shuttle hurdle relays.

The distance and middle distance events were expected to be a strength coming into the season for the Rams and this meet proved it.

Andrew Smith (1,600-meters) and Bryant Keller (3,200) helped the Rams to a long-distance sweep. Keller also placed second in the 800 in a personal-best time.

The hurdle events also proved to be strength for the Rams with the shuttle hurdle relay team of Boldra, Kaden Petersen, Grant VonEssen and Anthony Driscoll-Lee coming away with the gold. Driscoll-Lee also took the gold in the 110-meter hurdles with a personal best time.

Glenwood coach Cort Lovato said the Warriors were a state qualifier a year ago but lost nine starters from that team. Nevertheless, the coach was pleased with his team's performance.

"We knew they only had one starter coming back and they were young and out midfield is back, our backline is back and out goalkeeper is back so we were happy with how we stood going into the match," he said. "We were able to control the ball and move it around the way we wanted to.

Severn got the Rams on the board first off a corner kick. Jack McMullen notched the assist on a pass to Severn that he ping ponged off the Warrior goalkeeper once before finding the back of the net.

The Warriors came back to knot the score a short time later on a rare defensive breakdown by the Rams.

"We got countered down their left side and we had some guys on our backline got out of position and slotted it past (goalkeeper Casey) Godbout from the 18 (yard box)," Lovato said. "We got caught in transition and dove in on some tackles and didn't connect. Once we missed those tackles we were in scramble mode on our backline and we didn't communicate well enough."

The Rams did answer with a trio of goals in the final minutes of the half to take a controlling 4-1 lead into the break.

"We controlled a lot of the half," Lovato said. "Once we figured out what they were trying to do, we were able to take it away. They played pretty direct from the midfield and we were able step on their midfielders and kind of stop the ball being played. I was frustrated when the goal when it because of our lack of patience defending. But I felt confident we'd score one if not two more before half."

Cameron Kind and Jack McMullen each added their first career varsity goals for Glenwood.

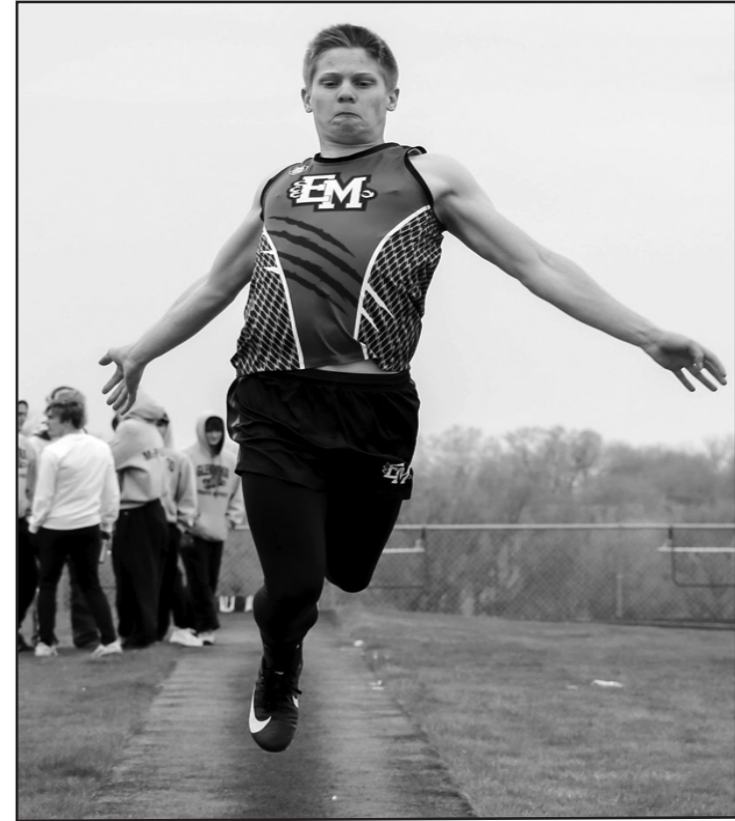

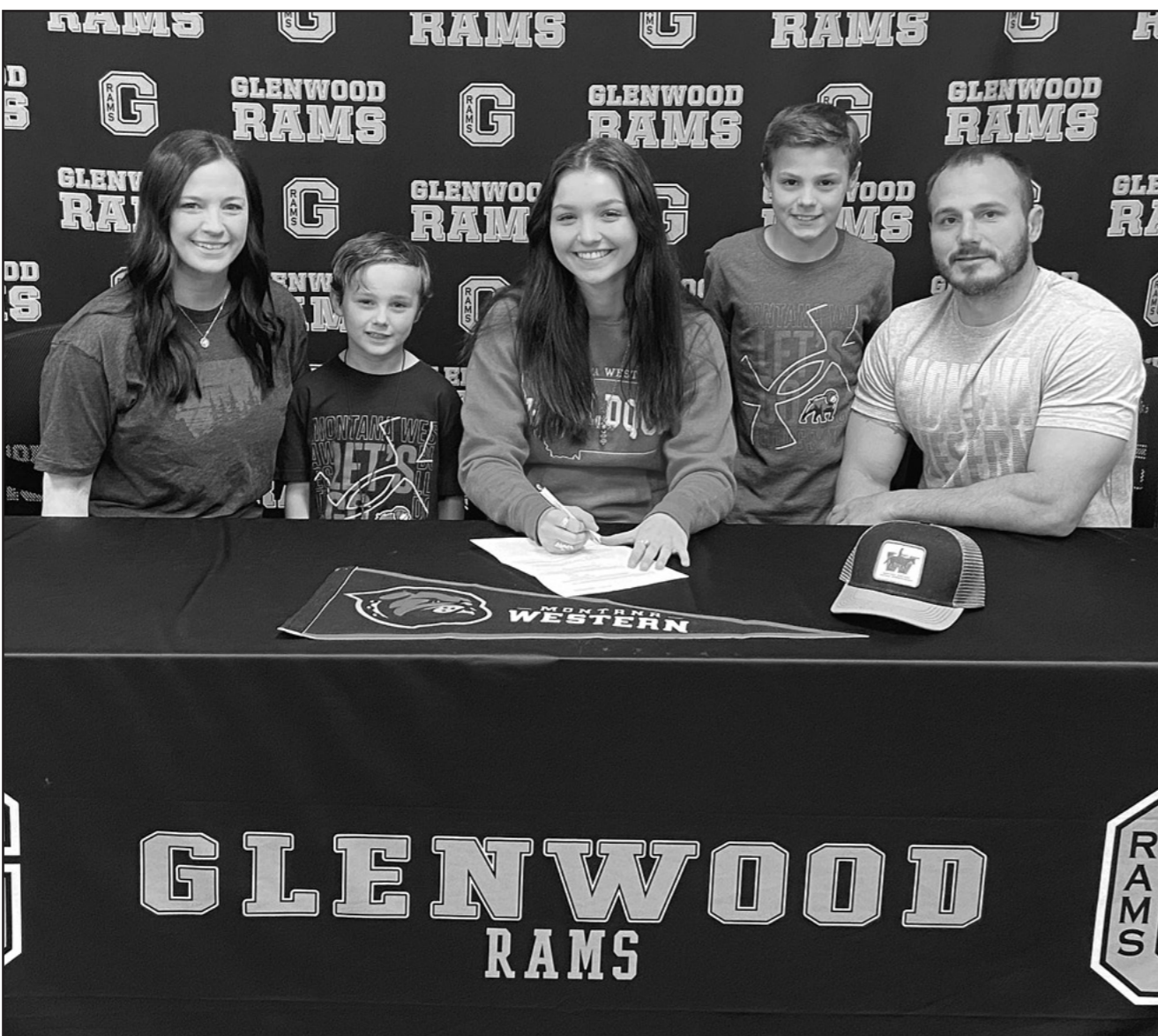

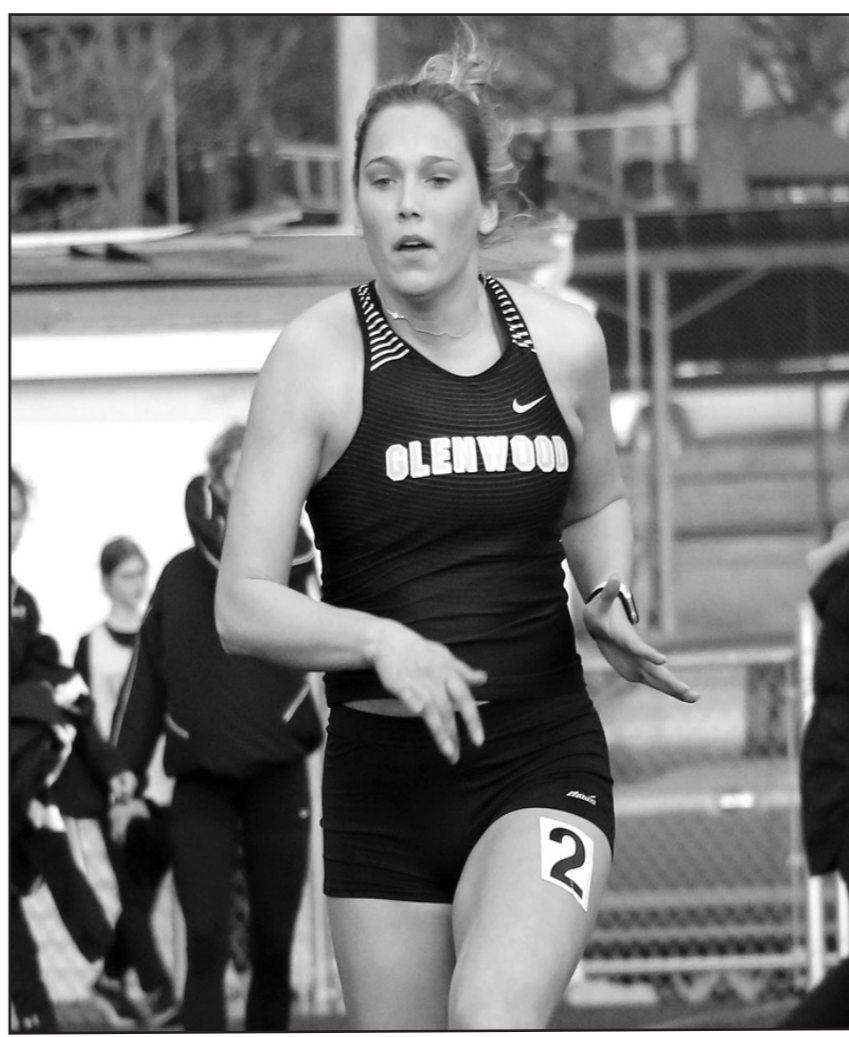
