Knights win regional track title, send 10 to state meet

The Fremont-Mills girls held off Council Bluffs St. Albert in the final event of the night to claim the team title at the Class 1A, District 9 state qualifying meet at Southwest Valley High School Thursday in Corning.

The Knights' claimed just one gold medal – Teagan Ewalt in the 400-meters – but punched 10 tickets to state while tallying 120 points, three more than runner-up St. Albert's 117 points.

"The girls competed amazingly," said Fremont-Mills coach Kyle Fichter. "The weather did not make for a good night, but our times were still very strong as we set two school records. We were hoping to get as many kids to the state meet as we could and just let the points fall where

Rams qualify for state in 19 events

The Glenwood girls and boys track teams combined to qualify in 19 events for the state meet at Thursday's Class 3A, District 3 State Qualifying meet in a rainy Carroll.

With chilly winds and a steady rain falling for most of the meet, the Glenwood girls won the district title with 137.5 points and qualified in 10 events. Council Bluffs Lewis Central captured the boys team title with 141 points. The Rams were third with 128 points and qualified for state in nine events.

The Iowa State Track and Field Meet commences Thursday at Drake Stadium in Des Moines. The Rams begin their hunt for a state title in the Class 3A portion beginning at 2:40 p.m.

In all, the Ram girls won four events and second in second in two others. The top two finishers qualify for state.

"We have prided ourselves all year on the overall strength of our team and it took everyone to claim the district title," said Glenwood girls coach Jordan Bueltel. "This was an absolutely loaded district, we knew how strong the competition was in the Hawkeye 10 and then you throw in a very good Carroll team and some outstanding runners from Ballard and Storm Lake, and we had to have one of if not the most competitive district this year."

Danika Arnold took home individual golds in the 200-meter dash, Breckyn Petersen in the 400-meter hurdles and added relay wins in the 4x100-meters and 4x200-meters.

The Rams had a particularly strong showing in the 400-meter

hurdles with Petersen and Carlie Clemmer sweeping the top spots. Clemmer added a third finish in the 100-meter hurdles to earn an at-large state bid.

Two Ram doubles teams headed to state

Glenwood's top two doubles teams are headed to the Iowa State Tennis Tournament.

The Rams No. 1 doubles team of Tyler Harger and Kayden Anderson won the Class 1A, District 8 title in Red Oak last Monday to qualify for state. The state tournament will be held May 23-24 in Waterloo.

Top-seeded Harger and Anderson were to play a familiar foe in the finals: the Rams' No. 2 double duo of Ben Batten and Brody Taylor. But with the top two finishers in singles and doubles advancing to state, Batten and Taylor also punched their tickets to state and the match was dubbed a 1-0 win for Harger and Anderson.

The state qualifiers are the Rams' first since 2018.

Rams on brink of state team bid

The Glenwood boys tennis team knocked off Audubon and Shenandoah in the Class 1A regionals Friday to advance to today's substate finals with a trip to next week's Iowa State Tournament on the line.

The Rams downed Audubon 6-0 in the regional opener and then finished off Shenandoah 5-0 to reach the substate finals.

"It was really fun to watch the guys compete at a high level winning two duals on Friday," said Glenwood coach Grant Stivers. "It's exciting to see them playing so well when it matters, can't wait for the opportunity on Wednesday to try and qualify as a team."

The Rams' Tyler Harger, Kayden Anderson, Ben Batten, Brody Taylor and Will Getter all went 2-0 in their regional matches.

Glenwood will host the winner of Council Bluffs Lewis Central and Denison at 3:30 p.m. with a trip to state on the line.

The fact the Rams are the home team is big for Stivers. It showcases just how consistent his team has been.

"It's just a product of the work the guys have put in all season," he said. "Being rewarded with their success to play on our courts and a place they are familiar with."

Glenwood clinches share of H-10 title

Glenwood wrapped up at least a share of the Hawkeye 10 Conference title with a 2-1 win over Denison in boys soccer last Wednesday.

The Rams' Cort Lovato, Jr. found the back of the net just four minutes in and Cameron King added a second seven minutes later.

Glenwood coach Cort Lovato said he felt the match was closer than it should have been.

"The boys were in complete,

control scoring two in the first 11 minutes," Lovato said. "We were able to control the midfield and place the strikers in favorable positions."

Leading 2-0, the match then took a decided shift at the 15-minute mark following a hard tackle on Lovato, Jr., that failed to draw a yellow. The play sidelined Lovato for the remainder of the match and the Rams never recovered their early rhythm.

"We as coaches need to do a better job in training to account for injuries in our midfield,"

Coach Lovato said. "The boys did a fantastic job adjusting; however, they were down a starter and fighting to overcome that. It was a real momentum changer. Denison didn't have an overwhelming attack up to that point. With one of our central mids out for the game, it made us more vulnerable through the middle and Denison took advantage of that."

Despite a heavy pressure from the Monarch attack, Ram keeper Casey Godbout was able to snag a penalty kick and keep Denison scoreless until a late corner kick.

"The boys were able to do enough for the win and a share of the H10 title," Lovato said. "It was a great feeling for the boys, bittersweet after losing to Lewis Central in shootout last week."

Glenwood's girls soccer team completed regular season play with a pair of victories early last week.

On Monday, Nora Dougherty scored six goals to lead the Rams to a decisive 9-1 win over Tri-Center. Jaylynn Floyd found the back of the net twice for Glenwood and Molly Williams added a goal. Hadley Carman and Alaina Meads had assists in the win.

Glenwood goalkeeper Audrey Nieman recorded a pair of saves.

"The girls played great all over the field," Glenwood coach Amy Benson said. "Defense played cleanly and offense found ways to score many goals."

The Rams closed out Hawkeye 10 Conference

play on Tuesday night with a 3-0 shutout over Denison-Schleswig.

Dougherty scored all three Glenwood goals with assists from Williams and Meads, while Nieman had a perfect night protecting the net.

"It is always a great feeling to win a conference game," Benson said. "We finished our regular season with a really great record. Now comes the work to prepare for postseason play. We will continue to work hard at practices over the next week and a half."

Glenwood finished the regular season on a seven-game winning streak and a record of 10-5 (6-1, second place in the Hawkeye 10 Conference). The Rams are scheduled to begin Regional play Friday night at home against Winterset. Kick-off is set for 7 p.m.

4x100, 4x200 and 4x400-meter relays.

Madelyn Berglund was fourth at Carroll in the 3,000-meters but her time of 11:18.09 was good enough to earn an at-large trip to state.

The Rams' 4x400-meter relay placed second and their shuttle hurdle and 4x800-meter relays placed third to earn nods via at-large bids.

"Overall an outstanding night and a heck of a track meet, the weather was a bit crazy, but the girls got out there and performed and we are excited to see what we can do this week at state," Bueltel said.

Glenwood boys coach Mark Starnier said he was pleased with his team's performance even if punching nine tickets to state was less than he and his team hoped for.

"Weather was an issue for everyone," Starnier said. "At times, it was a deterrent for good performances and other times, not as much. We had a line-up that we believed would give us the best opportunity to get as many things as possible to the state meet and potentially compete for the team title. We came up short of the team title, but we did get nine events qualified, and that's not too shabby."

Glenwood's boys' squad was led by the individual top finishes of Anthony Driscoll-Lee in the 110-meter hurdles and Bryant Keller in the 3,200-meters. Both were dual qualifiers with Driscoll-Lee finishing second in the long jump and Keller second in the 1,600-meters.

"He has been the go-to guy in hurdles this season for us," Starnier said of Driscoll-Lee.

"He has dominated the 110 highs at most of the meets we ran at, and this was no different. He beat the field by half a second and left no doubt of qualifying as the top high hurdler."

In the field events, Logyn Eckheart and Reagan Skarnulis had strong showings,

earning state bids in the discus and the shot, respectively.

"Eckheart entered the finals in third, but after the rain delay, was able to throw six feet further and finish runner up," Starnier said.

Keller flip-flopped with Council Bluffs Lewis Cen-

tral's Ethan Eichhorn in both the 1,600 and 3,200.

"He (Keller) took a different strategy into the race and dictated his own pace instead of playing into Eichhorn's hands," Starnier said. "Bryant forced him to work a little harder than he wanted to and was able to

claim the 3,200m title. In the 1,600, it was essentially a two-man race that would come down to the final 50 meters. Eichhorn would also take this race on a final sprint down the homestretch."

After finishing a disappointing fourth in the 4x800-meter relay, the Rams' dis-

tance medley relay team of Jackson Mulkins, Payton Longmeyer, Cooper DeLashmutter and Andrew Smith bounced back to run a 3:38.17 to finish second and earn a state bid.

"As a whole, the team collectively ran well, running five seconds faster than the season best time," Starnier said. "Our 200-meter guys were good through their exchanges and gave us good legs and handed the baton to sophomore Cooper DeLashmutter. Cooper ran a gutsy race, running down the pack and bringing us to the front for the final leg. Smith in the anchor would take command and battle LC's Eichhorn down the homestretch for an exciting finish."

Smith would go on to add a second-place finish in the 800-meters, again to the Titans' Eichhorn. Smith also anchored the last race of the evening, the 4x400-meter relay – along with Victor Cruz, Jake Shannon and DeLashmutter – that placed third and earned an at-large bid.

"While we were off our season's best time, we battled through the elements and put a respectable time together to get into the state meet," Starnier said. "We know we can go faster, as we've demonstrated that earlier. Hopefully with better conditions and fresher legs, we'll get a second chance to run faster next week."

The shuttle hurdle relay team Aaron McPherson, Aaden Lopez, Longmeyer and Driscoll-Lee ran their season best time, but missed the automatic bid fifteen-hundredths of a second to Lewis Central.

The Fremont-Mills golf team placed second at the Class 1A Sectional Tournament last Wednesday at the Fremont County Golf Course in Sidney.

Cumberland-Anita-Masena (CAM) topped the eight-team field with a score of 347. The Knights were the runners-up with a team total of 352, followed by East Mills at 355.

"What a day to be a Knight," said F-M Coach Greg Ernster "The boys shot well and got 2nd in our sectional."

The Knights were led by Owen Thornton, who finished in third place in the individual standings with a 79. Cooper Marvel and Caden Blackburn both finished at 90, earning a tie for 10th place, while Braden Turpin shot a 93 and JT Mahaney finished with a 96.

With their second-place sectional finish, the Knights advanced to the Class 1A District Tournament in Anita, played on Monday.

Fletcher Proctor was the top golfer for East Mills, finishing seventh with an 86. Kyle Williams and Anthony Anderson finished eighth and ninth, shooting 88 and 89 respectively.

On May 3, Fremont-Mills won the Corner Conference Tournament in Griswold, edging Sidney by one stroke for the title, 357-358. East Mills came in third place with a score of 360.

Marvel shot an 85 and finished fifth in the individual standings. Thornton, Mahaney and Blackburn shot 87, 89 and 96 respectively for the conference champs. Thornton and Mahaney finished sixth and eighth respectively. Turpin carded a 93 for 13th lac

For East Mills, Williams shot 84 and earned a third-place finish. Lincoln Palmer, Fletcher Proctor and Anthony Anderson finished ninth, 10th and 12th with respective scores of 91, 92 and 93.

Peyton Embree (110-meter hurdles), Davis McGrew (400-meter hurdles) and Zach Thornburg (100-meter dash) all notched runner-up finishes to earn individual state bids.

The Wolverines' 4x100 meter relay team of Ryan Stortenbecker, Thornburg, Mson Crouse and Matthew Haley were second and the shuttle hurdle relay team of Stortenbecker, McGrew, Jackson Embree and Peyton Embree ran second to earn state nods.

The East Mills girls' finished fourth with 64 points.

Emily Williams led the Wolverines with three individual bids and anchored the 4x400-meter relay team to a gold medal time. The senior won the 100-meters and the 400-meter hurdles and placed second in the 100-meters at the state qualifier.

Williams and Wolverines

teammates Jenna Thornburg, Miah Urban and Aspen Crouse capped off the district meet with a gold medal performances in the 4x400-meter relay. Their time of 4:20.80 was an "epic finish," Lang said.

"All four girls ran their best 400-meters of the season and competed to the highest level and earned the win in the final 50 meters," he said. "When Emily was within 10 meters starting the anchor leg, I knew she was going to win. Seeing them punch their ticket to state is easily one of my proudest moments as a coach at East Mills."

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MILLS COUNTY, IOWA, APPROVING AND ADOPTING A RENEWABLE ENERGY CHAPTER AS PART OF THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OF MILLS COUNTY, IOWA

WHEREAS, Mills County, Iowa, (the "County") desires to create long-range plans for its future and adopt standards by which to regulate solar energy systems; and,

WHEREAS, the County hired a professional consulting firm to review the County's existing plans, analyze its existing conditions, meet with members of the general public, and prepare a new chapter on Renewable Energy for incorporation into the County's adopted Comprehensive Plan; and,

WHEREAS, public input for this new chapter on Renewable Energy was obtained through an online community survey and at four separate public workshops; and,

WHEREAS, the process to create the new chapter on Renewable Energy was led by a steering committee of community leaders and stakeholders; and,
