Rams' Eckheart pledges to sign with North Dakota

Five minutes. That's all the time it took Logyn Eckheart to say yes. When North Dakota head football coach Bubba Schweigert extended a scholarship offer the Glenwood senior defensive lineman he needed to only run his decision by his parents before accepting the coach's offer. "I was pretty ecstatic," Eckhart said of the offer. "It was my first Division I offer, and I just thought all my hard work really came to this. I talked to my parents for a little bit before making the decision then I came right back in and told them." The commitment capped a busy summer for the 6-foot-3, 265-pound, two-time All-Hawkeye 10 player. He camped at Iowa, Iowa State, Northern Iowa and South Dakota State and mulled offers from multiple Division II programs before heading to Grand Forks for the school's football camp in July. Eckheart suspected he was bright on the Fighting Hawks' radar. Prior to the North Dakota camp he toured the campus and got a look at the school's football facilities. "The coaches basically told me they liked me and if I had good camp, they'd offer me," he said. "I've been to five or six camps this summer and it felt like I performed the best at this

one." Eckheart did indeed have a good camp. The 20 pounds of muscle he put on in the offseason and the speed and agility work showed out in the drills. "I feel like I got a lot quicker this summer," he said. "I think that my biggest thing was my speed and quickness and felt like my footwork in general really improved this off-season." He worked out at both defensive tackle and defensive end. The North Dakota coaches, primary recruiter, defensive line coach Austin Flyger, said they liked his athleticism, his footwork and how he used his hands. He's not sure what spot on the d-line he'll play but he prefers defensive end. The Fighting Hawks went 5-6 last season in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision. With his commitment out of the way, Eckheart said he's relieved. He can fully turn his attention to his senior season for the Ram football team. "All the coaches and the whole recruiting process is a big thing and I'm just glad I have a good place I'm going to go, and I can focus on my senior year of athletics now," he said. He grew up an Iowa fan, but coaches told him he didn't have the height they were looking for and he turned his attention to schools "that wanted

him." "North Dakota was that place," he added. Eckheart knows more offers could come as his senior season progresses, but he doubts he could be swayed. "After visiting and seeing the facilities and how the coaches were, I just knew it was the place for me," he said. "They welcomed me as family, and it felt like the perfect spot." He plans to major in either history or education with an eye towards being a teacher and coach after college. Eckheart and his Glenwood teammates open the football season at home Aug. 19 hosting Sioux City East. "I'm so hyped," Eckheart said. "With this being my last year, I'm just going to go all out, and I really think we're going to have a team that's going to surprise a lot of people this year."

DNR seeking assistance in helping count turkeys this season

The Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is looking for help with its annual wild turkey production survey. During the months of July and August wild turkey sightings are recorded to estimate this year's nesting rates and nest success. Participation is easy – just note the date and county in which the turkey was seen, if it was an adult female or adult male – males have beards on their breast – and if and how many poults (baby turkeys) were present. The survey is available online at www.iowadnr.gov/Hunting/Turkey-Hunting/Wild-Turkey-Survey. Annual population surveys conducted by the DNR are an important component of managing the wild turkey. Turkey populations can fluctuate annually across all regions of the state. All participation is appreciated.

Iowa DNR hosting youth hunter program Aug. 27

The Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is offering a program to teach skills needed to hunt, field dress and cook waterfowl to youth who have little to no waterfowl hunting experience on Aug. 27, at the Olofson Shooting Range, near Polk City.

The workshop will feature knowledge and skills building sessions with hands-on learning as well as a live-fire wingshooting.

“For those interested in the challenge of waterfowl hunting as a means of sourcing their own protein, this program provides the opportunity to learn the skills and knowledge it takes to do it all yourself,” said Jamie Cook, program coordinator with the Iowa DNR.

Participants will learn

basic strategies for hunting waterfowl such as proper equipment, where to hunt, safe shooting practices, and how to field dress, prepare and cook ducks and geese. The wingshooting session will provide lessons on shooting techniques and range time for those looking to improve their shooting skills.

The course runs from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m., and is designed for participants 8 years of age and older. The cost is \$35 for the course and includes a meal and a youth membership to Delta Waterfowl.
