# Rams fall in season-opening shootout

■ Weather delays kickoff by 55 minutes in a game that saw teams combine for nearly 1,000 yards of offense and 17 penalties

Rain and lightning delayed kickoff in Glenwood's season-opening "zero week" football game with Sioux City East by nearly an hour Friday.

A Black Raiders' offense that scored the most points on a Glenwood team in a season-opener in over 15 years and a defense that allowed just 17 yards rushing then denied the Rams a victory in a 50-33 set back at the Glenwood Athletic Complex.

Glenwood Coach Cory Faust played down the role the 55-minute delay might have had in his team's slow start.

"They had it too," the coach said. "There's no excuses. They played better."

The 50 points were the most surrendered by the Rams since a 35-0 loss to Kuemper Catholic to open the 2006 season.

Glenwood trailed 14-0 after a quarter and a half on Friday and found themselves playing catch up the rest of the way. Faust said he thought East was as good as advertised and had a great scouting report for his team.

"We knew they had a lot of good talent on defense but the disappointing thing for me was that we gave up that many points," Faust said. "We didn't get aligned right and we had some missed assignments. It's early in the year so maybe we put too much on the kids. We'll get better. We have good talent and good kids and now we have to choose to respond. We do that and we'll be okay."

The Rams' six first possessions of the game netted just 19 yards and two turnovers, but they found themselves down just 7-0 thanks only to a Black Raider interception for a touchdown.

But in the second quarter, trailing 14-0, Glenwood began to figure things out. After the Black Raiders muffed a punt, the Rams took over at the 29 and need just three plays to finally put their first points of the season on the board. Kayden Anderson connected with Cody Krause on a 21-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead to 14-6.

Sioux City East would answer with a 16 play, 80 yard-drive to take a 21-6 lead with four minutes remaining in the half but Glenwood was not content to limp into halftime. A pair of touchdown passes from Anderson to Krause – from 30 yards and 28 yards each, respectively – sandwiched around a defensive stop made the

score 21-19 heading into intermission.

The Rams' momentum was short-lived.

East marched 80 yards in 15 plays on the opening drive of the second half to put the Rams on their heels. Cole Ritchie's touchdown toss to A.J. Flemster from four yards out put the lead to 28-19.

But once again, Glenwood would respond.

After trading possessions, the Rams took over on their own 37. Three straight completions by Anderson set up a first down at the Black Raiders' 12-yard line. On the very next play, Anderson connected with Renner Bardsley across the middle and the senior muscled his way into the end-zone. The point-after would trim the lead to 28-26.

On the ensuing possession, the Rams appeared on the verge of getting the ball back after forcing a third-and-28 at their own 42, but Sioux City East would have none of it. Ritchie connected with his favorite target, Kelynn Jacobsen, who finished with 11 catches for 163 yards and a touchdown, on a 30-yard dart and a

first down. Four plays later, Brecken Schossow plunged in for the score. The point-after made in 36-26.

The huge third down conversion and the touchdown appeared to take the wind out of the Rams sails. They failed to convert a fourth and 13 from their own 49. Seven plays later, East added to their lead on a Brady Wavrunek 49-yard TD scamper.

Trailing 43-26, Glenwood would answer when Anderson connected on his fifth touchdown pass of the night – once again to Bardsley – but the ensuing on-side kick bounced right to the Black Raiders. Schossow's second 1-yard TD would cap the scoring.

After the game, Faust spent 10 minutes talking to him about their goals still being intact.

"I told the guys, the state champion in 4A last season had two losses in the regular season," he said. "So, we know this is how it goes. We knew Sioux City East was a really good team, so this was not a surprise. We always like to win but we knew either way, this was going to make us better for later in the season."

East chewed up the Ram defense

with their no-huddle offense that tallied 612 yards on 99 snaps. Ritchie threw for 363 of those yards but the Black Raiders had good balance, rushing for 249 yards.

Anderson and Krause had historic nights for the Rams. Anderson completed 24-of-44 passes for 346 yards and five TDs. His 24 completions are a school record. Krause hauled in a career-high 11 catches for 206 yards and three TDs.

Faust admits he missed most of his team's offensive play. He spent much of the second half huddled with his defense attempting to adjust to the Red Raiders' attack.

"We'll continue to better," he said. "We came in not thinking Cody Krause was going to play these first two weeks and obviously he's a weapon. Hopefully we'll have C.J. (Carter) back next week, losing him two days ago made us move some people around."

"Those aren't excuses by any means. Sioux City East is better, and we have to get better than we were tonight."

The Rams are back in action at

home Friday hosting Atlantic. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

# Name, Image, Likeness has arrived for Iowa high school student-athletes

The Iowa High School Athletic Association and Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union has released guidelines for high school students to gain compensation from their name, image and likeness.

In the updated guidelines released last Wednesday, students athltes cannot be reliant on athletic success, be used as an incentive to attend certain schools

or be provided by schools or by an agent of the schools. Students may earn compensation from the use of their Name, Image and Likeness (NIL) consistent with current IHSAA regulations and provided:

■ The compensation is not contingent on specific athletic performance or achievement.

■ The compensation (or prospective compensation) is not

provided as an inducement to attend a particular school (“undue influence”) or to remain enrolled at a particular school.

■ The compensation is not provided by the school or an agent of the school (e.g., booster club, foundation, etc.).

In seeking compensation for NIL, the student-athlete will not be allowed to use IHSAA or member school marks or logos

in any NIL activity or on apparel.

Other guidelines for students include:

■ Student should not reference the IHSAA or member school name or mascot for the purpose of any NIL activity.

■ The student should not use a member school’s facilities for the purpose of NIL activity.

■ The student should not

promote activities nor products associated with the following: gaming/gambling; alcoholic beverages, tobacco, cannabis, or related products; banned or illegal substances; adult entertainment products or services; or weapons (e.g., firearms).

■ The student and his/her family should seek guidance from his/her member school.

■ The student and his/her

family should seek their own legal counsel and tax advice when considering any NIL activity.

■ The student and his/her family should contact the NCAA, NJCAA, and/or NAIA to ensure any NIL activity does not jeopardize collegiate eligibility.

Iowa is the 15th state nationally to allow NIL for high schoolers.

# Iowa's dove hunter season set to begin Sept. 1

Iowa's sunflower and wheat fields will be popular places on Sept. 1, when thousands of hunters slip into the standing flowers and field edges in the early morning darkness for the opening day of dove hunting season.

Fast paced and fun, dove hunting can be done by nearly everyone regardless of skill level or mobility. It doesn't require expensive equipment to participate, only clothes that blend in to the background, a bucket and plenty of shells. There's a lot of action with a steady stream of doves coming in.

The Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) includes a list of wildlife areas at [www.iowadnr.gov/doves](http://www.iowadnr.gov/doves) where dove plots were planted and identifies the access point nearest the plot. Hunters are encouraged to do some pre-season scouting to see if the sunflower planting was successful or if it was stunted or damaged from the summer heat wave or hail storms.

"It really comes down to getting out there and looking at the area to check the condition of the dove field, then scout it a day or two ahead of the season to see if and how the doves are using it," said Todd Bogenschutz, upland wildlife research biologist with the Iowa DNR. "Doves have moved in to the state in



larger numbers after we broke from our high heat wave. Success will depend on how many remain here on opening day and that depends on how many cold nights we have between now and the opener."

Hunters looking for Plan B may want to focus on private land silage or hay fields, or where farmers harvested small grain fields, grazed pastures or feedlots.

Dove plots are getting in-

creasing busy on opening day and hunters are encouraged to be courteous to one another, to pick up their spent shell casings and other trash and leave the field in good condition. Dove hunting is a good opportunity to introduce someone new to the sport because there is often a lot action.

Dove season is Sept. 1-Nov. 29. Shooting hours are one half hour before sunrise to sunset. Daily bag limit is 15

(mourning or Eurasian collared) with a possession limit of 30.

Hunters are reminded that their gun must be plugged to hold no more than three shells. If hunting public areas north of I-80, hunters should check to see if nontoxic shot is required. The Iowa online Hunting Atlas at [www.iowadnr.gov/Hunting/Places-to-Hunt-Shoot](http://www.iowadnr.gov/Hunting/Places-to-Hunt-Shoot) identifies all county, state and federal land open to hunting, zone information and nontoxic shot requirements.

All dove hunters are required to register with the Harvest Information Program (HIP). It's free, fast and the information is used to help determine participation and

harvest.

New way to register for the Harvest Information Program (HIP)

All hunters who pursue migratory game birds are required to register for Harvest Information Program (HIP) either through the Go Outdoors Iowa app on their smartphone, through a link at [www.iowadnr.gov/waterfowl](http://www.iowadnr.gov/waterfowl) or at [www.gooutdoorsiowa.com](http://www.gooutdoorsiowa.com). The DNR has detailed instructions on how to register for HIP online at [www.iowadnr.gov/waterfowl](http://www.iowadnr.gov/waterfowl).

Migratory game birds mean more than ducks and geese; in Iowa it includes mourning doves, ducks, geese, coots, doves, woodcock, rails, and

snipe.

Once registered, hunters will need to write a confirmation number on their license, print an updated copy of their license with the confirmation or take a screenshot of their confirmation on their phone to show proof of registration. Requiring a confirmation number will allow the DNR to better track migratory bird hunters – a federal requirement.

"Hunters need to be sure not to skip HIP," Bogenschutz said. "If you're having trouble, call our customer service number and our staff can help to get you registered over the phone."
