Wolverines into district semifinals

East Mills had four players score eight or more points and the Wolverines slowly pulled away from Bedford for a 54-40 victory in the Class 1A District 8 semifinals in Malvern Thursday.

East Mills edged the Bulldogs 41-38 back in December, but Wolverine's head coach Kevin Schafer said his team didn't have a good night offensively in that win.

"I thought it was important we get off to a good start offensively," Schafer said. "They held us down pretty well the first time played them. I thought offensively we gained some confidence. I thought Peyton Embree and Zach Thornburg played their best games in a while. Both of them. Getting other players to play well along with (leading scorers) Mason (Crouse) and Braden (West) is very important."

Crouse scored 17 and West 15 to lead the Wolverines. Thornburg added 11 points and Embree eight.

The Wolverines also held an advantage on the glass, grabbing 14 offensive rebounds.

"We had a lot of put-back points," Schafer said. "Braden West rebounded really well inside as did Peyton. They both went up strong and got a lot of points that well. We played well defensively pretty much all game. We did a much better job locking up their dribble drive."

The Wolverines (18-5) advanced to last night's district semifinals at Clarinda. Results of that game were not available as of publication (see coverage on www.opinion-tribune.com).

East Mills 61, Diagonal 31

East Mills got off to a good start offensively and defensively and overcame some bumpy second half play in a 61-31 victory over Diagonal in Class 1A, District 14 boys basketball quarterfinals in Malvern Monday night.

The Wolverines opened the game on a 12-3 run and saw that lead extend to as many as 19 in the first half.

"We had a great first half, on both ends of the floor,"

Rams 8th at state meet

Glenwood advances two to finals for first time since 2006

DES MOINES - For the first time in over 15 years, the Glenwood wrestling team had two grapplers reach the finals at the Iowa State Wrestling meet concluding Saturday night at the Wells Fargo Arena.

The Rams' Matthew Beem and C.J. Carter swept through their respective 126 and 195 pound brackets to wrestle for state championships. Beem (24-4) scored the first two points on a takedown of Benton Community's Jaiden Moore (41-0). But Moore rallied for a 5-4 decision.

Carter (51-3) faced a tall challenge in his finals match against West Delaware's Wyatt Voelker (44-0), the No. 1 ranked 195-pounder in the state who is also ranked No. 9 nationally. Voelker repelled nearly every Carter attack in a 19-7 major decision victory.

While both matches didn't go the duo's way, Glenwood head coach Tucker Weber said the Rams had a great weekend.

"It's kind of disappointing to go

0-2 in the finals but I'm proud of the kids and how they wrestled all year," Weber said. "To come home with two second place finishes and a fifth place

finish I'm pretty proud. And to finish in the top 10 as a team with three guys, that's pretty impressive."

Vinny Mayberry placed fifth in his

113-pound bracket to give the Rams their third medal winner at state. Mayberry scored an 11-3 major decision win over Creston's Cole Schmauss (36-7) in the fifth place match.

Burlington Notre Dame edged Osage 109 to 108.5 for the Class 2A team championship. The Rams finished eighth with 55 points, seven points better than Hawkeye 10 Conference champion Atlantic.

Weber wasn't at all surprised Beem made the finals, even if some in Des Moines might have been. The sophomore missed half the season recovering from off-season elbow surgery and while he entered state ranked No. 5 in his weight, he'd wrestled just 24 varsity matches entering state.

"He wrestled really well and he's got that in him," Weber said. "He was out half a season but he's got that potential and he's got really good stuff and he showed it this weekend."

Against the top ranked Moore in the finals, Beem showed he deserved to be in the finals.

"I always preach if you go hard for

Rams rally in fourth for regional victory

Win and advance.

Glenwood did just that Saturday night as the Rams erased a 10-point deficit in the fourth quarter to pull out a 60-57 Class 4A regional semifinal victory over visiting Lewis Central.

The victory improved Glenwood's record to 18-4 on the season and advanced the Rams into a Tuesday night regional championship match-up with Winterset (see coverage on www.opinion-tribune.com).

For over three quarters, the Titans (12-11) controlled the ball and the scoreboard. Typically, a 2-3 zone defense, Lewis Central matched up man-to-man with the Rams all game long.

"They had a great game plan, and we took a while to adjust," said Glenwood coach Brian Rasmussen.

Junior Jenna Hopp led the adjustment Glenwood needed in the fourth quarter after the Rams found themselves trailing 49-39 with less than seven minutes left in game. Hopp took over from there, scoring eight consecutive points over the next three minutes to trim the LC lead to 49-47.

The teams traded field goals and free throws down the stretch with Hopp continuing her hot shooting. She knocked down a pair of free throws with 1:46 left to give the Rams a 55-53 cushion. The lead was short-lived, however, as the Titans' Brooke Larsen drove to the basket for a layup to knot the score.

Glenwood failed to score on its ensuing trip down the court and Lewis

Central had an opportunity to run the clock down for a final shot after taking a timeout. Instead, the Titans dribbled the ball toward the basket and Ram sophomore Danika Arnold came away a steal. Arnold passed the ball up the court to teammate Madison Camden who sent the Glenwood crowd into a frenzy when she converted the bucket. Camden was fouled on the play and knocked down the subsequent free throw to give the Rams a 58-55 lead with 31 seconds left on the clock.

Lewis Central cut the lead to 58-57 on another Larsen layup but allowed the Rams to bring the ball up the court and run valuable time off the clock. Hopp was finally fouled with 3.2 seconds left. She converted both free throws and then deflected the Titans' long inbound pass to seal the victory.

The game was tightly contested from the onset, but Lewis Central was in the lead for most of the night.

Fremont-Mills falls in rugged quarterfinal loss

Stanton edged Fremont-Mills 39-22 in a rugged, defensive-minded Class 1A, Region 8 quarterfinals Tuesday in Stanton.

Fremont-Mills coach Brett Weldon was happy with how his competed to the end.

"We pulled within three with about six minutes left, but could never get over the hump," the coach said. "It wasn't pretty by any means, but we battled and played hard. Defensively, we executed our plan extremely well. We gave them multiple looks defensively and had some success."

In a game that featured 39 fouls and 41 free throws, neither team could find a rhythm offensively. The Knights shot a season-low 16.2 percent from the field (6-of-37). The Viqueens weren't much better at 25.7 percent (9-of-35).

"We held them to nine field goal and 18 of their 39 points were from the free throw line, most of them coming late when we had to foul," Weldon said. "I can't fault our effort and attention to detail on the

five or six straight minutes I'm going to be proud of you whether it's a win or a loss," Weber said. "I truly believe that he fought for six minutes so that's kind of what I told him. It sucks but the good thing is he has two more years to climb that podium. You know, it's tough in the time but yeah those are ones you like to get."

In the 195-pound finals, Voelker, who will wrestle collegiately at Northern Iowa, seemed prepared for every Carter attack and was able to turn the Ram junior's natural aggressiveness against him in the major de-

cision.

"I'm proud of him," Weber said of Carter. "There's not many kids he doesn't tech fall or pin and CJ got him a little flustered and the kid didn't open up as much as he probably wanted to but we knew it was going to be a dog fight. We were hoping to try to keep it close, a little bit closer than that. We were planning on winning obviously but against a kid like that you've got to tip your hat to him for how much work he's put into it."

All season Weber has talked about how Carter took a huge step techni-

cally this year. It showed at state, he said.

"I just kind of told him after the match, that's the difference between a kid that wrestles on the off season all year round and a kid that wrestles three to four months out of the year," he said. "Hopefully he gets a little edge this year in the off season and sees his potential because he's got a future in football and wrestling. It's just going to be up to him what he wants to play in college."

Carter's 51 wins are the second most in a season, behind only 2016 State Champion Matt Malcom's 52

wins.

The Rams couldn't have opened their 2022 state tournament any better, going 3-0 with three falls in the first round.

"We were planning on three wins," said Glenwood coach Tucker Weber. "We didn't know they'd all come by fall. That's an added bonus. They all looked good. Vinny and C.J. pinned their guys in the first period and Matt was in the second period."

Carter needed just 1:18 to pin his first round opponent, Brenden Casey of Atlantic.

With all three of Glenwood's qual-

ifiers making their second trip to Des Moines, there were no first time jitters or nerves with these three, Weber said. All three were aggressive and all three wrestled their matches.

"That's their style," Weber said of the trio's aggressive attack. "They've all been here before. That helps. Some kids get to the state tournament the first time and kind of get nervous. These three have all been here so that helps them."

And all three have likely not made their last trip to Des Moines. Beem and Mayberry are both sophomores and Carter is a junior.

said East Mills coach Kevin Schafer after the game. "And then defensively we had some guys lose focus and stop doing what they were doing. I'm guessing some of that had to do with the score differential. We talked about staying focused for four quarters at this time of year.

"We can't have these sort of let-ups. Some of them did have a better fourth quarter defensively."

After taking a 33-15 into halftime, East Mills scored the first six points of the third quarter and looked all but prepared to blow the Maroons out of the water. But a cold spell that saw them connect on just one field goal the remaining 6:30 of the frame allowed Diagonal to respond with an 8-0 run of their own and had the lead to 12 at one point.

The Wolverines got the lead back to 42-25 to open the fourth quarter. But that lead quickly jumped to 53-27 thanks to back-to-back layups by Braden West, a three-pointer

and a layup by Jackson Embree.

"We played better in the fourth quarter – but not as good as the first half," Schafer said.

Too many times in the game, Schafer said, his team was careless with the ball or didn't do the little things that separate good teams from great ones in the postseason.

"We had too many fast breaks where we made bad decisions and ended up with nothing," he said. "We'd have a turnover or a tough shot. We should have had much better shots than we got. Offensively we also got a little stagnant and guys were standing around. It became a one-on-one show and we're not quite good enough to play like that."

West notched a double-double for the Wolverines with 18 points and 11 rebounds and Mason Crouse chipped in 14 points.

Ben Werneck scored 10 points to pace Diagonal.

East Mills 49, Lenox 39

It was a bold strategy.

Nursing a slim lead after a rough third quarter that saw Lenox shrink East Mills' margin from 17 points to six, East Mills coach Alexis Moreno elected to go to its version of the four-corner stall to open the fourth quarter.

Her decision paid off.

The Wolverines (19-4) had no field goals but went 11-of-14 at the free throw line, and perhaps more importantly, limited the Tigers' possessions in the fourth quarter to pull out a 49-39 victory in the Class 1A, regional quarterfinals Tuesday in Malvern.

"I noticed when we were getting past half court, we were getting one pass and thinking we had to shoot it and we were losing confidence and not taking great care of the ball," Moreno said of her team's third quarter drought. "Being able to take time off the clock and limiting their possessions is what we wanted to do. We weren't making shots like we were in the first half. And we didn't want a one-and-done on our end and them getting extra chances to score."

Lenox (16-4) was 3-of-12 from the

field and 0-of-3 at the line in the fourth quarter.

The Wolverines started the game red hot. They hit all four of their first quarter three-point attempts and led 17-10. That lead swelled to as many as 16 in the second quarter as East Mills' hot shooting continued. They finished the half 6-of-8 from behind arc. Miah Urban had four of those three's and led the way with 16 first half points.

The third quarter would tell a different story, however.

Leading 34-19 at the half, the Wolverines got a quick bucket from Emily Williams just seconds into the half to match their biggest lead.

Turns out, it would be East Mills' only field goal of the quarter. They would hit just 1-of-13 shots in the frame and go over six minutes without a point. The Tigers would use the opening to pounce.

Lenox rattled off seven straight points and then turn that into an 11-2 run to make it 36-30 with just over two minutes to go in the third.

"We had a very good shooting first half and that cushion really helped us when they started coming back," Moreno said.

The difference would remain six heading into the fourth quarter.

With Williams, Urban and fellow guard Natalie Goodman either holding the ball or dribbling around and between defenders for long spells, the Tigers were forced to foul.

Williams missed the Wolverines' only field goal attempt in the fourth, but she hit 7-of-10 free throws in the quarter.

The Tigers didn't manage to cut the lead to 42-39 with just under two minutes to go on a three-pointer by Sadie Cox but that was as close as they would get.

Defensively, the Wolverines were tough all night, grabbing nine steals and blocking 10 shots. Eight of those blocks coming from Williams.

"Our game plan was to get in the faces of perimeter players so they couldn't see the big girls inside," she said. "And we did a very good job of digging down when Lenox got it in the lane. We took pride in that. That was key for us, and I think we executed it really well."

Urban finished with a team-high 19 points and Williams added 14.

Zoey Reed scored 19 points to lead Lenox.

Falcons end Knights' season

Colin Lillie dropped in a career-high 42 points to lead Council Bluffs St. Albert to a 75-49 victory over Fremont-Mills in the Class 1A, District 14 quarterfinals in Council Bluffs Feb. 14.

Fremont-Mills coach Steve Raymond was proud of his team's play in a tough environment.

"I always ask our boys to 'put a product out on the floor that our community can be proud of,'" Raymond said. "I know the final score looks bad, but we were only down 10 with a minute to go in the third quarter. I think that effort fits our quote."

The Falcons (10-11) led 31-26 at the half but outscored the Knights 44-23 after halftime.

"Basically, the game came down to them wearing us down with their pressure and trapping," Raymond said. "Our boys executed our game plan and took away some things they do really well. I was very pleased with that."

The Knights shot 38.6 percent from the field (17-of-44), including 3-of-16 from behind the arc.

Raymond commended the play of his guards - Brady Owen, Ike Lemonds, Kyle Owen - against the Falcons' aggressive man-to-man defense.

"They did a great job of handling pressure and getting us set up in the half-court," he said. "Paxten Van Houten also helped out a lot in this capacity from the forward spot. We did a good job of limiting live ball turnovers and made them work to score in the half-court. Unfortunately, the Lillie kid got hot and we couldn't stop him."

Lillie made 15-of-23 shots on the night, including 7-of-13 from behind the arc, for his game-high scoring night.

Jake Malcom led the Knights with 23 points and 10 rebounds.

"Jake is the epitome of Fremont-Mills athletics," Raymond said. "The kid is an absolute joy to coach and a great leader that raises the effort and play of his teammates. He is a multisport athlete that has success in everything he does. The kid is a true winner on and off the court and will have success no matter what he does in the future. I couldn't ask for a better kid to coach and he will be greatly missed from our program."

The Knights close their season with a record of 8-15 overall and 4-6 in the Corner Conference.

Stortenbecker 1-2 at state wrestling

Making his first appearance at the Iowa State Wrestling Meet, East Mills' Ryan Stortenbecker finished 1-2 at the Wells Fargo Arena.

"To win matches at state you have to finish takedowns and reversals to score points," said East Mills coach Claude Lang. "In his win, he did just that. In his two losses, his opponent's just had better defense than his offense."

"We are all very proud of his state qualification in his junior year. And he is already using his

loss as motivation for next season to get on the medal stand."

The junior 145-pounder lost his opening round match to Alburnett's Carson Klostermann by third period fall. But Stortenbecker rebounded to pin MFL-Mar-Mac's Tristen Koehn to advance in the back half of the bracket.

Stortenbecker's state run would end in his next match, a 7-1 loss to Emmetsburg's Ryan Brennan.

He closes his season with a record of 35-9.
