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Rams' season ends in quarterfinals

Playing Council Bluffs Lewis Central for the second time in four weeks, Glenwood again got off to quick start and an early lead but like that earlier meeting it was the top ranked Titans that pulled away for the win.

The Rams saw their season end in Friday's Class 4A quarterfinals in a 47-24 loss. With the win LC, the defending state champs move within two wins of a second straight state title.

"I thought our guys' effort and energy were there," said Glenwood coach Cory Faust after the game. "They believed they could win the game and they prepared really hard. Lewis Central is just so hard to prepare. They can do so many different things. They were better than us. Our hats are off to them."

In their previous match up with the Titans, the Rams led 22-20 at the half before falling 58-22.

And once again Glenwood looked like the better team early. After holding the Titans to three-and-out on their first possession, the Rams took over at their own 39 and 10 plays later struck first on the scoreboard when Tate Mayberry raced around the right side for an 8-yard touchdown run. The point-after gave the Rams the early 7-0 lead.

The score would remain that way into the second quarter.

But the Titans wouldn't stay silent for long. Quarterback Braylon Kammrad engineered a four play, 54-yard drive he capped himself from seven yards out to get the Ti-

tans on the board. They would miss the point-after, but they wouldn't be done on the scoreboard in the frame.

After forcing a Rams punt, Kammrad found the endzone again from a yard out to make the score 13-7. Another Glenwood punt sent

the Titans up at their own 20 with just under seven minutes to go in the quarter. Kammrad again came up big with a 15-yard TD toss to Curtis Witte in a five play, 80-yard drive to extend the Titans' lead to 20-7 with five minutes to go before halftime.

Trailing 20-7 after a first half that saw them punt it four times and turnover it over on a fifth heading into intermission, Glenwood appeared to regain some of the momentum on their opening drive of the third quarter.

Mayberry broke off a 60-yard

run on first down to set the Rams up at the Titan 20, but a penalty and the Titan defense stalled the drive there. Conner King's 40-yard field cut the lead to 20-10 but that's as close as the Rams would get.

Lenox downs Fremont-Mills in postseason rematch

Fremont-Mills dug itself a hole and could not dig itself out in the Eight-player football quarterfinals Thursday.

Just three weeks after Lenox notched a 28-2 win over Fremont-Mills in the regular season finale, the Knights led 8-6 late in the first quarter before the Tigers scored 26 unanswered points to pull away for a 32-8 win.

Much like that first match up, the Knights' offense ran the ball effectively and efficiently but down two scores for much of the game, they were forced to pass. And that's not their comfort zone, said head coach Greg Ernster.

"We didn't have a hard time running it," Ernster said. "There was a five minute window where if we changed a few things and we didn't have to throw the ball, we were running it at will and doing what we wanted to do. Once we got behind, we were fighting the clock and them."

"We were much better offensively than the first game. Our kids blocked assignments

correctly and Taylor did a good job running the football. We just got behind where we had to get out of game plan running the ball and throw it and that's not our forte."

Trailing 18-8 at the half. In the third quarter the Tigers got a touchdown run from Keigan Kitzman and an interception return for a touchdown by Sampson Adams to ice the win.

The Knights had just 119 total yards in the first meeting but ran it 37 times for 167 yards (4.5 per carry) in the rematch. But quarterbacks Taylor Reed and Luke Madison combined to complete just 5-of-18 passes for 73 yards and three interceptions. In all F-M had four turnovers.

"I feel like we played much better than we did in round one when we played them," Ernster said. "Defensively our game plan was to make them throw and we did make them throw but unfortunately they just did a really good throwing it. We executed our game plan, we just didn't finish it off on the back end."

The Titans scored on their next three possessions - on a pair of Kammrad TD passes and a Johnathan Humpal scamper - while forcing a Ram punt and interception defensively to go ahead 40-10 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Rams got a 55-yard touchdown catch and run from Renner Bardsley and another from Mayberry in the fourth quarter, but it was too little too late.

Glenwood finished with 393 total yards in the loss. Mayberry led the Rams' ground attack with 151 yards and two scores. Anderson was 9-of-34 passing for 143 yards and was picked off twice.

"It seemed like early we didn't create as many big plays," Faust said. "Credit to them. They obviously had a good plan, and they have good players. I thought our guys were still able to make big plays, just not enough."

Kammrad had a night for the Titans. The senior signal-caller had a hand in 6 TDs (two rushing, four passing) and finished 9-of-15 passing for 202 yards. Humpal ran for 148 and a TD.

"I thought we had a good plan," Faust said of his defense. "We moved some guys around to some different spots to get our best guys on the field but at times, it was just a little bit different and the things that Lewis Central

does, we weren't able to execute on."

The Titans (11-) move on to face Carlisle (10-1) in a semi-finals rematch of a week two game the Titans won 28-21.

The Rams close their season at 7-3 and as just the third team in school history to win playoff game. The 1994 and 2016 teams both reached the state semifinals.

"I thought we continued to improve all year," Faust said. "Credit our guys for their resiliency. This has been the worst I've been a part of for team injuries and bad luck and our guys could have thrown the towel in and quit trying to get better, but they didn't do that."

"We had some guys change positions that maybe they didn't want to do but they did it for the team and they kept getting better. We're only the third team in school history to win a playoff game. They have a lot to be proud of. They left their mark on this program and made this community proud."

In all, more than 30 seniors suited up for the Rams in their final game Friday.

"They brought our community a lot of pride and entertainment and they brought our program back up a level," Faust said. "The leadership of these guys and the talent are leaving some big shoes to fill. I'm really thankful to have been able to coach them."

And throw the Tigers did. Quarterback Gabe Funk had thrown just 57 times all season entering but the sophomore completed 9-of-12 against the Knights for 154 yards. All three of his touchdown passes went to Adams, a senior who caught just 12 passes entering the game. He grabbed five for 104 yards Thursday.

Ernster wasn't surprised Funk was able to make the plays with his arm instead of his legs - he's rushed for nearly 600 yards this season - but a handful of Knight defensive breakdowns helped.

"He's a great athlete," Ernster said. "Sadly, the two big pass plays that stand out in my mind was a kid running wide open down the middle of the field where we had a missed assignments and they got an easy score. Another time we were late getting there and they got one right before half."

Lenox finished with 241 total yards but they were bottled up on the ground, running for 87 yards on 37 rugged carries.

Paxten VanHouten led the Knights' defense with 6.5 tackles

Lenox (11-0) moves on to face Remsen St. Mary's in today's state semifinals. Kickoff is scheduled for 4 p.m. in Cedar Falls.

Fremont-Mills closes its season with a record of 8-3. In all, nine seniors played their last game for the Knights in the quarterfinals.

"This crew has played in a lot of big games," Ernster said, adding five of the seniors started or played key roles in the Knights' state finals appearances in 2020.

"These guys have done a lot for our program. Paxten VanHouten has been a leader of that. He started as a freshman. We've had a lot of great games with these guys and they've done so much for our program."

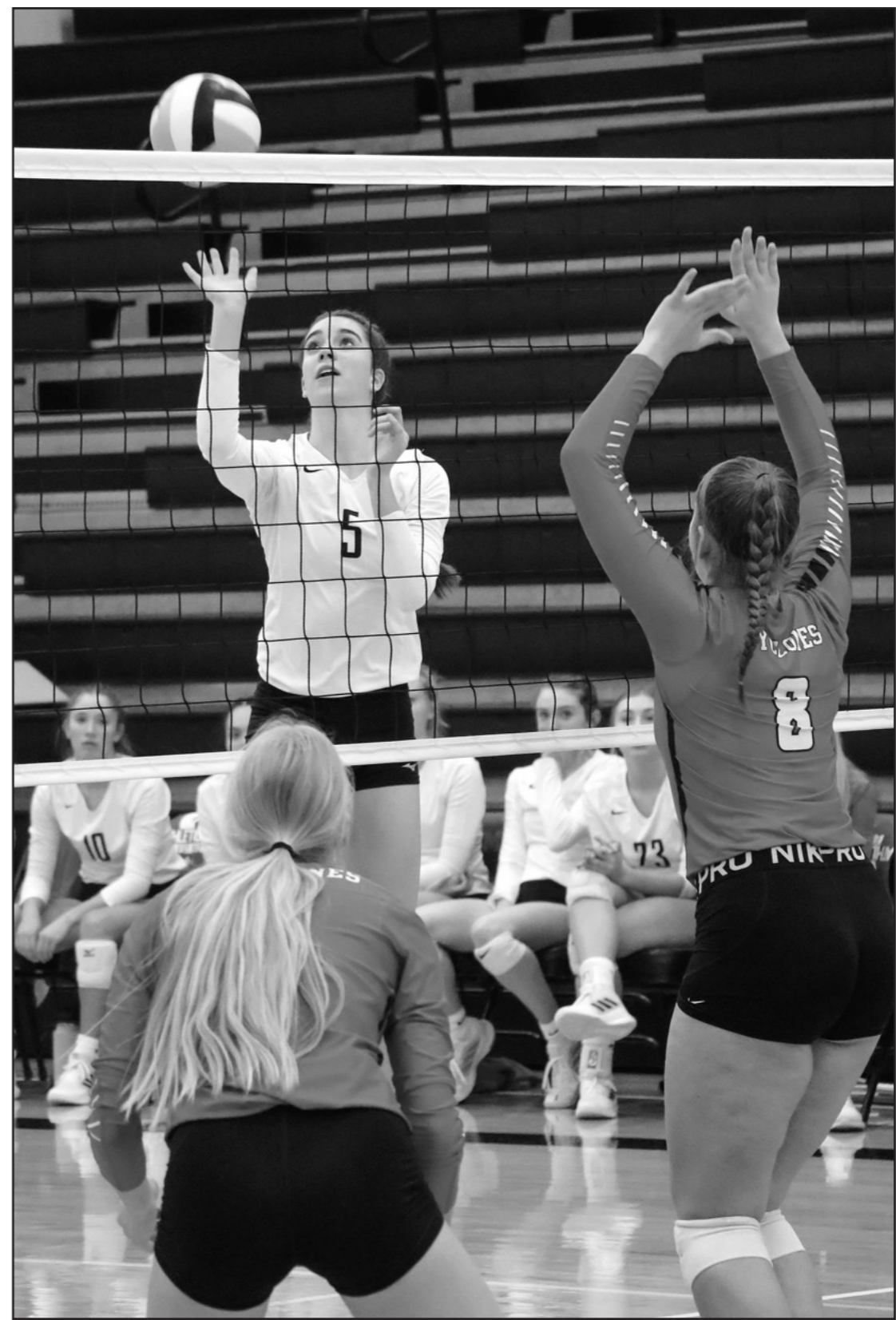
Roenfeld, a sophomore outside hitter, led the Rams with 222 kills and was second with 51 blocks this season.
